DUKE BEATEN BY M'GILLIVRAY IN 220 AT DETROIT

[Associated Press by Federal Wireless] DETROIT, Mich., April 16.—Perry McGillivray of the Illinois Athletic Club defeated Duke Kahanamoku here last evening in the Detroit Athletic Club tank in the 220-yard swim. The time was slow, McGillivray finishing the furlong in 2:28, which is seven seconds behind the record chalked up by Harry Heber, and 4 3/5 seconds slower than the mark set by Herbert Vollmer in New York recently. Duke Kahanamoku has beaten the time made by McGillivray, having made 2:26 2/5 in the Suro tank.

Duke has yet to win an event in the East with the exception of the special 100-yard event. In tank swimming the world's champion has failed to show the usual speed, but it is expected that McGillivray, Vollmer and perhaps Clem Brown will come here this summer to compete in open water. Notwithstanding Duke's defeats in the eastern tanks, he should be a favorite when he meets the stars at the naval slip.
