

3-YEAR TRIP IS PLAN OF MR. AND MRS. F. J. GREEN

On a three years' trip which will include many months in the deep South Seas, Mr. and Mrs. Francis J. Green are outgoing passengers on the Oceanic liner Ventura this afternoon. They will go first to Sydney and after touring a large part of Australia, New Zealand and New South Wales will voyage up into the South Seas. Eventually, if the war is over within the next two years, they will return to Honolulu by way of Europe. Mr. Green is deputy trade commissioner of New South Wales for the Hawaiian islands, and will investigate southern commercial and trade matters with a view to drawing the attention of American and Australian businessmen to the advantages of more trade between the countries.

SPIRITUALISM IS DECLARED EVIL

The Peace Palace was well filled last night as Evangelist McCord spoke on the stirring topic as advertised: "Spiritualism Exposed." He said: "Spiritualism, both in its ancient and modern forms, is Satan's masterpiece. This dangerous 'ism' is rapidly controlling the world, and is adding to its platform all that is most fascinating and dangerous in the false religious systems of today.

"Spiritualism must owe its origin to one of four things, namely: To fraud, to the spirits of our dead, to loyal angels, or to demons. Is it a fraud? The answer, yes, and no. It is a fraud in that it misleads people as to the identity of its principal agents. It is not a fraud, for its wonders are not always accomplished by trickery. This is the testimony of such well known investigators as Alfred Russell Wallace, F. R. S., Sir William Crookes, F. R. S., Sir Oliver Lodge and many other prominent men in the scientific and literary world. These men tell us in grave and sober speech that the spirit of a girl who died 100 years ago appeared to them in visible form. She talked with them, gave them locks of her hair, pieces of her dress and her autograph. They saw her in bodily presence, felt her person, heard her voice; she entered the room where they were and disappeared without opening a door. These savants declare that they have had numerous interviews with her under conditions forbidding the idea of trickery or imposture.

"Is it the spirits of our dead? The word 'soul' and 'spirit' occur in the Bible over 1600 times, or the spirit an immortal spirit.

"Is it the work of loyal angels? It is impossible to believe that angels of light could so forget themselves as to be guilty of the pranks played by unseen forces in the seance chamber. Though they are all ministering angels still they would not stoop to the deception acknowledged by the mediums themselves.

"As spiritualism has flourished in the past so it will prosper to the end. It was spiritualism perhaps more than anything else that brought about the ruin of ancient Israel, and the same power is doing the same work among the professed people of God today. Spiritualism destroys faith in God and the Bible."

No meeting will be held at the Peace Palace tonight, but the subject for Tuesday will be, "The United States in Prophecy." Come and hear the history of this wonderful nation given in the Bible, and the part it will play in world politics and religion.

BIG ISLAND AND MAUI SUFFER FROM STORMS

Considerable damage has been suffered on Hawaii and Maui as a result of the torrential rains of the last week, according to news received in Honolulu. The storms on Hawaii were accompanied by thunder and lightning, some damage being done by the latter at O'ahu. On both islands the roads suffered as a result of the downpour. Manager Charles F. Eckart of O'ahu Plantation, while driving along the government road in his automobile, narrowly escaped being struck by lightning.
