BEAUTY CHATS

A Lung Bath To broaden your shoulders, to expand your chest, to develop your bust, and fill out the hollows around the neck—try a lung bath every once in awhile.

This is a specialized form of breathing, not deep breathing exactly, but more effective. You breathe new air into certain parts of your lungs at a time, expanding each part to its fullest capacity.

Stand outdoors, or before an open window, or any place where you can get a full supply of fresh pure air. Put your hand over the upper part of your right lung, and concentrate your mind on this portion of it. I tell you to put your hand on your chest simply because that action helps you to hold your mind on that spot. And you must have your mind on it to force the air into it. Otherwise you would simply be taking deep breaths all through the chest.

And, while these would be extremely good for you, this concentrated method of breathing would be even better. Having centered your attention on that part of your lungs, breathe in as much air as you can, forcing it all into the spot under your hand. This will be a bit difficult, but not as much so as you imagine. It will take a few days' practice, then you can do it easily.

And then, move your hand to the lower right portion of the chest and repeat, then to the upper and lower left portions as well.

After a week of this, doing it twice a day, three breaths to each part of your chest—you will feel like a new person. You will have brighter eyes, rounder cheeks and a better complexion, and you will feel much more vigorous.

The lower part of my arms are quite plump enough, but the upper part is too thin to look pretty. What can I do to make the upper part fatter, without affecting the rest of the arms?—J. J. Reply—The thing I would recommend first is to swim as much as you possibly can. This will develop the upper arm, and will not fatten the lower if it should not have flesh put on it. You can treat it of course, with flesh-building creams, and a night massage. This will help, but exercises and swimming will be much better.
