BILL PROVIDES LARGE SUM FOR ISLAND HARBORS

House Would appropriate Over Quarter Million for Improvements and Maintenance

Copies of a bill presented to the house of representatives recently by the committee on rivers and harbors, providing between \$100,000 and \$150,000 for a breakwater at Kahului harbor, \$10,000 for maintenance of the same, and continued improvement for the harbor at Honolulu with an appropriation of \$106,800, have just been received at headquarters of the engineers division of the Hawaiian department.

Dredging work of a big portion of the harbor entrance has just been completed by the local engineers, and a breakwater project would be entirely new work. Word has not yet been received as to what vote has been taken on the question.

Officers at the engineers' headquarters state that the breakwater, if approved, would probably be built of rock, rip-rapped together. It would be a work of considerable magnitude, fashioned after surveys made in previous years, and reported to the 62nd Congress under House Document No. 1330. Following is the portion of the proposal as it affects Hawaiian waters:

"Harbor at Honolulu, Hawaii, continuing improvement and for maintenance, \$106,000.

"Harbor at Kahului, for maintenance, \$10,000.

"And for the construction of the west breakwater, Kahului harbor, in accordance with the report published in House Document 1330, 62nd Congress, 3rd session, \$100,000: Provided that the secretary of war may enter into a contract with contractors for such materials and work as may be necessary to prosecute the said project, to be paid for as appropriations may from time to time be made by law, not to exceed in the aggregate \$150,000, exclusive of the amount herein and heretofore appropriated."

Money for Honolulu harbor would be used to carry on the dredging work that has been in progress here for several years, and for a portion of which bids were opened and contract awarded a few weeks ago.

ARMY & NAVY COMPANY B HAS BIG ATTENDANCE AND FINE DRILL

Only six men were missing from Company B, National Guard of Hawaii, when that organization met under Capt. Alan Lowrey in the armory last night, and these six all had excuses filed.

According to National Guard officials this is a fine showing for the company under its new organization, made following a get-together meeting called to see whether it should continue or be disbanded entirely. Lack of attendance by members was the reason for calling the former meeting.

Officials point out that the company is starting out in fine style with a showing in attendance such as was made last night, and with a snappy drill as well. Following the drill period the company spent some time in further reorganization.

Capt. Lowrey has two new assistants—1st Lieut. Jack Radway and 3d Lieut. Percy Deverill—appointed in orders issued yesterday from guard headquarters.

TERRITORY MAY LEND PRISONERS FOR ROAD WORK

As soon as the present construction work on the Round Top-Tantalus road is completed territorial prisoners may be put on the old Makiki road which is at present in an impassable condition, according to Superintendent Charles R. Forbes of the public works department.

Superintendent Forbes says that he intends putting the question up to the city and county supervisors to see if they will be willing to supply material for the road providing the big gang of prisoners now on Round Top can be used for labor.

"I should like to call the attention of residents of Tantalus to the fact that the new road will be entirely closed to traffic before long," says Forbes, "just as soon as we begin macadamizing it. Then it will be absolutely necessary for persons to take the old road in going to and from their homes."

This macadamizing is expected to take several weeks at the very least, the work being held up often by heavy showers on the mountain. The superintendent thinks something should be done toward putting the old road in passable condition for the present.

MAUI GUARD TO UNDERGO FINAL BIG INSPECTION

To complete the inspection of six new National Guard companies on the island of Maui, and also to inspect the regimental and battalion headquarters on the island, Adj.-gen. Samuel I. Johnson and Col. C. S. Lincoln, who is the guard inspector from the regular army, will leave on Saturday afternoon.

In addition to these inspections the Machine Gun Company and the 3rd Infantry band, situated at Paia, will be visited. Following the completion of these inspections the full regiment is promised by the war department. Battalion headquarters are at Wailuku, Lahaina and Paunene, the regimental headquarters being at Paia. The two officers will return early Tuesday morning in time to participate in the Memorial Day parade.

CONCESSION QUESTIONS CONSIDERED BY BOARD

After more than an hour's argument on the question the park committee of the supervisors yesterday afternoon finally agreed to refer all who apply for a permit to peddle peanuts, ice cream, sandwiches, etc., in Kapi'olani park during the Kamehameha Day celebration to the polo association, which will set apart a space inside the fence for such occasions. It was at first decided to restrict the peddlers to this space, not to allow them in the city's portion of the park, but after some argument it was finally agreed that every poor Japanese or Hawaiian who thinks he can make a dollar or two by peddling in the park while all the rest of the city is abounding should be welcomed with open arms.
