OLAA ONCE MORE HOLDS INTEREST OF INVESTORS

More Than Half of Transactions on Busy Day Are of This One Stock

Again today Oahu and Olaa were the strongest features in the sugar stock market. Both of them were in much demand and easily led the market in strength. Waiialua continued to be rather freely offered and it was said that some smaller stockholders were worried at the institution of the suit that was filed against the company Wednesday and were selling. In commenting upon this a prominent broker used the expression "needlessly frightened by the institution of a friendly suit."

Further advances have been scored by Mineral Products, which was quoted early in the morning at \$1.07 1/2. Relative to this property, C. C. Backus stated to the Star-Bulletin that early next week he would have a statement on what he learned of the property upon his recent visit to the mainland.

In transactions amounting to more than half of the day's business in shares traded in, Olaa advanced to \$23. Waiialua recovered from yesterday's weakness and sold up to \$37. Oahu rose to \$41.75 and Onomea advanced a quarter. McBryde sagged off an eighth, but recovered and closed at yesterday's best price.

Sales for the day totaled 11,383 shares.

TWO WOMEN IN FRACAS; ONE IS FINED BY COURT

The story of a battle in "Blood-town," near Wahiawa, on May 19, was told in the police court this morning by Anna Watts, complaining witness against Barbina Grant on a charge of assault. The defendant was found guilty and fined \$5.


