ALLEGE 'GANG' HOLDS SWAY AT WAIKIKI BEACH

Break up the Waikiki gang; cut out the rough stuff on the beach; this was the essence of the prosecution's plea to Judge Monsarrat in the police court today in the case of Archie Boyd, accused of assaulting George H. Willey, manager of Heinle's Tavern. Boyd was found guilty and fined \$50.

Apparently an ordinary "fight" case, the trial developed this morning into a plea of law-abiding citizens for order and decency about Honolulu's great playing place, Waikiki Beach.

Attorney Frank Thompson represented the prosecution "in the interests of Honolulu's respectable citizens," he said. As an old friend of Boyd's father, Attorney William J. Sheldon took the young man's part.

Thompson told the court that Boyd was one of a big "hoodlum" gang that was bulldozing Waikiki Beach patrons. The attorney let out on this class of toughs.

Testimony showed that on the night of May 20 in Heinle's Tavern, Boyd struck Willey without provocation and knocked him down. It was said by several witnesses that Boyd was pretty drunk. It is said he also cursed frightfully in the presence of women and broke wine glasses in the bar. The whole trouble seems to have started when Willey asked Boyd to pay his bill and informed him that he had no credit at Heinle's Tavern.

"New York has its Bowery; Chicago, Detroit, San Francisco, all have their tough places," said Thompson, "and that's what a certain gang is trying to make out of Waikiki Beach. There is a bunch of drunken derelicts like 'Steamboat Bill' and 'Tough Bill' that needs cleaning out. Their very names suggest their character."

Attorney Sheldon pleaded for the pardon of a friend, saying that everyone loved some wild oats and that this was a simple case of reaping.
