SHERIDAN TAKES 17 OFFICERS TO COAST

En route from Manila to San Francisco the U. S. army transport Sheridan arrived here yesterday morning and departed for the coast late last night with 17 officers, among them Gen. John P. Wisser, Col. W. E. Rafferty and Lieut.-col. F. W. Coe. Others who embarked for San Francisco were 14 second-class passengers, 75 enlisted men, 25 general prisoners and 12 sick men.

The Sheridan had no passengers for Honolulu and only small consignment of freight, consisting of Manila cigars and furniture. She took from here officers' household goods and mail.

The inter-island steamer Likelike left for Kaula yesterday on a special trip for sugar.

The American-Hawaiian steamer Texan left Hilo today for San Francisco with 14,000 tons of sugar.

The next mail for San Francisco will go in the Matson steamer Lurline tomorrow at 10 a. m. Mail closes at 8:30.

The tender Alert and the four K submarines which have been to Lahaina on a practice trip will return to Pearl Harbor Friday.

The Hind-Rolph Shipping Company of San Francisco recently bought the American bark John Ena for \$180,000, which is the second recent addition to their fleet.

The Oceanic steamer Sonoma arrived at Pago Pago today bound for Sydney, and the Ventura will arrive there tomorrow on the way to Honolulu.

The inter-island steamer Kilauwa will come off the drydock this afternoon following a general overhauling and engine repairs.

The Matson steamer Hyades will arrive here tomorrow from Puerco Sound with 2417 tons of freight for Honolulu, 300 for Port Allen, 665 for Kahului, 115 for Kaunapali and 160 for Hilo.

With 18 cabin and seven deck passengers the inter-island steamer Claudine arrived yesterday from Maui with 16 polo ponies, seven race horses, one automobile, 10 barrels wine and 201 packages of sundries.

With 39 cabin and 5 steerage passengers the inter-island steamer Mauna Kea arrived today from Hilo. Her freight was one automobile, 14 crates of chickens, 18 turtles, 27 bags of coffee, 59 bags of cane seed, 358 bags of sugar, 10 cords of wood, 132 bundles of flooring and 547 packages of sundries.

The inter-island steamer Mauna Kea arrived yesterday from Kaula with 23 cabin and 32 deck passengers. Her freight cargo consisted of 7500 bags of sugar, one pig, 40 empty beer crates, 100 empty chicken wire crates, 100 empty chicken wire crates, 151 bags of taro and 104 packages of sundries.

BILLY SUNDAY MAKES MONEY.

BALTIMORE, Md.—The Billy Sunday campaign in Baltimore cost \$90,000. In the tin cans at the tabernacle and in cash contributions there was taken in \$36,611.42. Of this \$40,374.44 was for a free will offering for Mr. Sunday himself and \$4265.83 was taken up for charitable institutions.

SHIP JOHN ENA IS SOLD FOR \$180,000

(Special Star-Bulletin Correspondence) Hilo, June 5.—Captain C. V. Olsen, who is well known in Hilo, and who is captain of the big windjammer John Ena, has written to "Ned" Austin and told him of his travels and the voyage of the big ship, he is in command of. The captain writes to say that the John Ena has been sold to the Ralph Navigation Company for \$180,000; "not a bad price after 25 years of service," remarks Captain Olsen. The captain continues: "The freight for two voyages pays for the ship, so that it is all right."

The John Ena made the trip from San Francisco to Melbourne, Australia, in 60 days and the captain earned a bonus right there. If he does as well coming back from Sydney, where he will proceed from Melbourne, he will earn another bonus; "so that all right, too. The John Ena will take a cargo of coke from Sydney to San Francisco. Captain Olsen wishes to be remembered to all Hilo friends."

BOATS PERMITTED TO GO THROUGH CULEBRA CUT EVERY TWO DAYS

With 14,824 tons of through freight for Vladivostok and Yokohama the British steamer Kumerick, Capt. C. S. Newton, 30 days from New York via the canal, arrived here last night and departed this morning at 11 o'clock.

According to Capt. Newton vessels are now going regularly through the canal, but boats are permitted to go through the Culebra cut only every other day, as there is still considerable work to be done on the cut and the government is endeavoring to give the women as much uninterrupted time as possible.

SITUATION NOTICE

PUBLIC HEARING, JUNE 27, 1916. PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT OF KING STREET EXTENSION FROM McCULLY STREET TO AND INCLUDING THE STREET INTERSECTION OF KING STREET AND BERETANIA STREET, AT MOILLI ROAD, IN HONOLULU, T. H.

TO THE OWNERS, LESSEES AND OCCUPANTS OF LANDS ABUTTING ON SAID PORTION OF KING STREET, PROPOSED TO BE ASSESSED FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF SAID STREET, AND TO ALL PERSONS INTERESTED GENERALLY: NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of Honolulu, in accordance with Resolutions Nos. 349, 383, 384, motion of February 3, 1916, and Resolution No. 524, propose to improve that portion of King Street from McCully Street to and including the street intersection of King Street and Beretania Street, at Moillili Road, in the District of Honolulu aforesaid, upon a frontage basis.

FRONTAGE TO BE ASSESSED. The frontage to be assessed consists of the mauka or northeasterly property line and the makai or southeasterly property line abutting upon said King Street Extension and upon the street intersection of King and Beretania Streets within the end limits aforesaid, as more particularly set forth in the Engineer's report, dated June 1, relating to said improvements and hereinafter referred to and incorporated by reference.

MAIN THOROUGHFARE: CONTRIBUTION TO COST BY CITY AND COUNTY. Since by Resolution No. 349, as amended by 383, said portion of King Street was declared a main of general thoroughfare, the City and County of Honolulu propose to assume and pay out of General Revenue 33.13% of the cost of improvement.

CHARACTER OF IMPROVEMENT AND MATERIAL. (a) The grading, surfacing and paving with bituminous on a crushed rock base of King Street Extension. (b) The curbing with lava rock of all uncurbed property and the moving and resetting of present curbing where necessary. (c) The installation of storm drains of concrete where necessary.

ASSESSMENTS PROPOSED. (1) The cost of the entire improvement, less the proportion to be borne by the City and County, and also less the cost of new curbing; shall be paid by general assessment of the maximum rates of \$3,320.63 per front foot against all lands abutting upon said portion of said street, as described, both sides included. The total frontage (including 292.0 feet frontage opposite cross streets and City and County property) is 6140 feet. (2) The cost of new curbing shall be paid by assessment at the maximum rate of \$0.45 per front foot against the abutting lands in front of which the same shall be laid, there being approximately 5890.0 feet.

ESTIMATE OF COST. (1) The maximum estimate of the entire cost of the improvement, including engineering and final grading, is \$3,320.63 per front foot. (2) Total estimate of cost of new curbing, 2,650.50 (3) 33.13% of cost of Contribution of City and County to Main Thoroughfare 10,194.80 (4) Maximum estimate of cost of the general improvement to be assessed on a frontage basis after deducting items specifically borne is 20,388.70 (5) Total frontage subject to assessment for the general improvement 6,140 ft. (6) Maximum rate to be assessed per front foot for the general improvement, exclusive of cost of new curbing 3,320.63 (7) Total frontage subject to assessment for the construction of new curbing 5,890 ft. (8) Maximum rate to be assessed per front foot for the cost of new curbing when necessary 0.45 All of which appears in more detail in the Engineer's Report, hereinafter referred to and herein incorporated by reference.

FURTHER DETAILS. The map and general plans, and other data so prepared by the Engineer, in his modified report dated June 1, 1916, and adopted by the Board, with respect to the proposed improvement (incorporated herein by reference), may be seen and examined by any person interested, at the office of the City and County Engineer and of the City and County Clerk at any time during business hours, prior to and including June 27, 1916. Resolutions Nos. 349, 383, 384 and 524 (incorporated herein by reference) are on file in the office of the City and County Clerk.

A PUBLIC HEARING respecting the proposed improvement will be held before the Board of Supervisors at their Assembly Hall in the City and County of Honolulu on Tuesday, June 27, 1916, at the hour of 7:30 o'clock p. m., or as soon thereafter as those interested may be heard, at which time and place a full opportunity will be given to all persons interested, to present suggestions or objections to the proposed improvement or any part or detail thereof.
