THEATRICAL OFFERINGS

DE COE IS WONDER AS EQUILIBRIST

Startling indeed are some of the stunts that Harry DeCoe does in his act, which will be one of three big vaudeville turns at the National theater's farewell performances, beginning with tomorrow's matinee. While seated in a chair, supported on two legs by only the edge of an upended table, he fills a glass from a decanter, drinks the contents, and then produces a cigarette, which he lights and smokes.

Again he balances a chair on a broom handle, bridging two chairs. He sits at apparent ease in chairs resting on two legs on the tops of champagne bottles, and then goes that one better by placing the bottles on top of other bottles. After a number of such feats he gives his grand climax, a feat which causes the audience to hold its breath in fear.

Cook and Oatman, two of the cleverest burlesque and comedy entertainers ever seen in Honolulu, return for the last week with an entirely new act.

THEDA BARA HAS CHARMING PART

Theda Bara, playing two weeks' engagement at the Hawaii theater, is somewhat of a novelty, especially so when it is considered that this talented French actress is seen in such opposing roles in her two big bills. Her last offering, "The Devil's Daughter," was one of her strongest vampire parts and in it Miss Bara, while winning her audience by her rare ability, was compelled to portray a repulsive woman.

For the present week "The Two Orphans" is the feature. As Henrietta and Louise, the Misses Bara and Jean Sothorn, respectively, have ideal roles. Especially is this true of Theda Bara, who is seen in a part that calls for the full sympathy of her audience. Here she is seen in strong contrast with any of her previous screen work as the good, lovable girl whose sweet little blind sister is her sole care.

NEW FAVORITES ARE AT LIBERTY

As was predicted by their many friends and admirers, Cleo Ridgely and Wallace Reed only needed an opportunity in stellar roles to become big favorites of film playgoers. They have that opportunity in "The Golden Chance," the week-end Liberty theater feature, and they come up to every expectation.
