## MACCAUGHEY IS LECTURING ON HAWAII IN WEST

### Plans to Study at University of Chicago Following Close of Summer Season

That the northwest is feeling the "pinch" of the recent boom, but that agricultural conditions in the Middle West are prosperous is pointed out in a letter which has been received from Vaughan MacCaughey, former professor at the College of Hawaii and now on the Chautauqua platform with headquarters in New York City.

Professor MacCaughey delivered a series of lectures on Hawaii at the summer session of the University of Oklahoma, which is attended by more than 800 students. In part, his letter is as follows:

"I went from San Francisco directly to the state of Washington, where I delivered a series of lectures upon the natural history of Hawaii at the state normal school. I was much interested in the sociological and economic developments in the northwest; it appears that this part of the country has suffered from the 'boom' spirit of a few years ago, and now the larger cities, as well as the country, are feeling the pinch. I was informed by a number of men that hundreds and thousands of families have migrated from the Pacific coast back into the Idaho, Montana, interior.

"I was fortunate in having an opportunity to visit the University of Washington at Seattle. They have a splendid plant and are now erecting a number of new buildings.

"Agricultural conditions in the Middle West are apparently prosperous. The stock farms are also doing a big business, particularly the horse farms.

"I have been much impressed by the great progress of the prohibition movement. State after state is swinging into line, and there seems to be a universal conviction that the states which have gone 'dry' will never return to the old regime. I have not seen a saloon since I left San Francisco.

"I came from the northwest by way of Denver and am giving a series of lectures at the university here (Oklahoma university). They are having a large session over 800 students, despite the hot weather. From here I go on to the University of Chicago and the University of Pittsburgh, with lecture series at each place. At the close of the summer I plan to return to the University of Chicago for some advanced work and studies.

"The subjects on which Professor MacCaughey spoke at the University of Oklahoma were 'Polynesia,' 'Hawaiian Songs and Legends' and 'The Schools of the Tropics.'

## THEATRICAL OFFERINGS

### 'ELEVEN TO ONE' STARS MISS HART
