

PUBLIC HEARING, AUGUST 29, 1916

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT OF BERETANIA STREET FROM KING STREET TO NUUANU STREET, IN PALAMA, HONOLULU, TERRITORY OF HAWAII.

TO THE OWNERS, LESSEES AND OCCUPANTS OF LANDS ABUTTING ON SAID PORTION OF BERETANIA STREET, PROPOSED TO BE ASSESSED FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF SAID STREET, AND TO ALL PERSONS INTERESTED GENERALLY:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of Honolulu, in accordance with Resolution No. 556 and Resolution No. 568, propose to improve that portion of Beretania street from King street to Nuuanu street, in Palama, in the District of Honolulu aforesaid upon a frontage basis.

I. FRONTAGE TO BE ASSESSED.
The frontage to be assessed consists of all that frontage, both sides included, abutting on that portion of Beretania street distant 120 feet from a City Survey Monument located at the intersection of the mauka twenty (20) foot offset lines of King street and Beretania street, in Palama, to a line across Beretania street passing through a City Survey Monument near the Ewa side of Nuuanu street.

II. MAIN THOROUGHFARE: CONTRIBUTION TO COST BY CITY AND COUNTY.
Since by Resolution No. 556 said portion of Beretania street was declared a main or general thoroughfare, the City and County of Honolulu propose to assume and pay out of General Revenue 33 1/3 per cent of the cost of improvement.

III. CHARACTER OF IMPROVEMENT AND MATERIAL.
(a) The grading, surfacing and paving with 3-inch of "Bitulithic" on a six (6) inch concrete base of Beretania street from King street to Nuuanu street, Palama section.

(b) The curbing with lava rock of all uncurbed property and the moving and resetting of present curbing where necessary.

(c) The installation of storm drains of concrete or Armaco ingot iron where necessary.

IV. ASSESSMENTS PROPOSED.
(1) The cost of the entire improvement, less the proportion to be borne by the City and County, and also less the cost of new curbing, shall be paid by general assessment at the maximum rate of \$5.413018 per front foot against all land abutting upon said portion of said street, as described, both sides included. The total frontage (including 530.1 feet frontage opposite cross streets and alleys, 170.0 feet on Nuuanu Street, 225.0 feet on Ala Park and 80.7 feet on government land), is 4,057.2 feet.

(2) The cost of new curbing shall be paid by assessment at the maximum rate of \$0.45 per front foot against the abutting lands in front of which the same shall be laid, there being approximately 200.0 feet.

V. ESTIMATE OF COST.
(1) The maximum estimate of the entire cost of the improvement, including Engineering and incidentals, is maximum, \$33,077.50

(2) Total estimate of cost of new curbing 135.00

(3) 33 1/3 per cent of cost of Contribution of City and County to Main Thoroughfare 10,980.00

(4) Maximum estimate of cost of the general improvement to be assessed on a frontage basis after deducting items specifically borne by 21,967.70

(5) Total frontage subject to assessment for the general improvement, 4,057.2 feet

(6) Maximum rate to be assessed per front foot for the general improvement exclusive of cost of new curbs \$5.413018

(7) Total frontage subject to assessment for the construction of new curbing 300.0 ft.

(8) Maximum rate
