Will Duke, Cunha and Kruger Set New Mark?

Fast Natators Will Compete in 500-Yard Event to Annex the World's Record Held By Hatfield—Girl Swimmers Will Set New Tank Record for Hawaii Tonight—Banner Crowd is Expected to Witness Record-Breaking Performances Here

Everything that is possible in the aquatic line will be featured at the Y. M. C. A. this evening. For those who want sprint races the 80-yard event in which Duke, Lane, Cunha and others will go after Daniels' record. If you want a longer race there is the 200-yard swim, which will bring the stars out for Heberner's mark.

These events alone would attract a large crowd in any city, but linked with them one finds long distance events featuring the 500-yard swim, in which the world's record is in danger, breast stroke, back stroke, relays, novice events and girls' events. All together the program as outlined at the "Y" tank tonight will be the best ever given in an indoor meet here.

One of the big features that is attracting much attention in swimming events at present is the girls' events in which the best feminine swimmers will compete. The four fastest swimmers in Honolulu among the fair sex, Ruth Stacker excepted, will compete tonight in the 50-yard open event. The event is certain to bring out fast time, and with Helen Rosa, Carrie Lane, Lucille Legros and Bernicia Lane the swimming enthusiasts will have a chance to pick the winners. This should be a great race to the finish line, and very few have volunteered a guess as to the winner.

In the novice event there are many girl swimmers who will give an example of what is coming in the future races. According to Ruth Stacker, considered to be the leading authority on girls' races, the novices will finish the 50 yards in close to the time made by those in the open event. If this be true then the future feminine races in Honolulu are assured of success.

For some time the swimmers of the world have been aiming at Hatfield's record in the 500-yard event. Tonight the local stars will attempt to set a new mark. Duke, Cunha and Kruger have been making time close to the six minute mark, and that old record is going to receive an awful scare tonight, if it is not broken. It is to be expected that on Saturday evening about 9 o'clock the record for this distance will not belong to Mr. Hatfield.

All Features.

As a matter of fact there isn't a real feature in the events tonight, but all are features. It is worth a visit to the tank to watch the girls and the other kids in the novice events. "Stubby" Kruger will do something in the backstroke and the diving features promise to bring out a thrill, especially the sensational dive which is listed on the program.

The Illinois Athletic Club holds the record in the 200-yard relay, but Duke, Cunha, Kruger and Kelli should set this time back. It will be a great event, and listed with the others concludes a good program.


