**48-HOUR TEST IS
 FINISHED TODAY
 BY OAHU FORTS**

Coast-Defenses Conclude Two Days' War-Footing Drill in Successful Manner

At 2 o'clock today the 48-hour test of the coast defense for Oahu completed a 48-hour war-footing drill, in which the men of the Oahu forts, including Ruler, De Ruyter, Armstrong and Kamehameha, watched, ate and lived beside the guns as if an enemy fleet were likely to be sighted at any moment and to bombard the island's shores.

This test concluded the first practice required annually under war department regulations. All the officers and men necessary to handle and fire the guns, find ranges, watch through telescopes and in other ways man the batteries efficiently took part in it. The men camped at their stations, part of them sleeping while the others were on watch. Food was brought them by special details of enlisted men ordered to perform that work, and temporary bunks were made up alongside the guns, where part of the men could sleep while the others maintained a constant lookout.

Half of the annual target practice is now completed. The balance will be finished next week. It will be known as additional practice and will be given each coast defense fort having two companies assigned to it.

The second, or additional practice, will consist of a different range-finding section furnished to each fort having two companies. The section will work out problems connected with coast defense work. The first practice, which closed this morning, was entirely satisfactory, according to Hawaiian department officers.

**STRONGER TONE
 SEEN IN LOCAL
 STOCK MARKET**

Considerably better tone was manifested in the local stock and bond market this morning. Though it was a half-holiday the volume of business was fairly large and prices showed a strong tendency to rise. This was in the face of little-changed reports on the strike situation which appeared quite as serious as it did Friday.

Extra dividends by Hawaiian Commercial and by Hawaiian Sugar of \$1.20 for the former and \$1 for the latter undoubtedly had a strengthening effect on the whole list. Hawaiian Sugar will pay in all dividends of \$1.50 per share on September 15—that is, 7½ per cent; and Hawaiian Commercial \$1.25, which is 5 per cent.

Between boards sales amounted to 650 shares of stock and \$3,000 in Olan 6 per cent bonds. At the session sales amounted to 365 shares and \$2,000 Olan 6s. San Carlos rose to \$16.25. Other sales were Olan \$17.37½, McBryde \$12, Hawaiian Sugar \$45, Hawaiian Commercial \$51.50, Wai'alua \$36 and later \$36.25, and Ewa \$35. In unlisted stocks 1500 Mineral Products sold at 95 cents and 1500 Mountain King at 60 cents.

**FRANKLIN SAYS
 HE IS NOT OUT
 FOR BENCH JOB**

Bitting Admits Application for Judgeship and Declares Has Much Local Backing

Attorney Cornell S. Franklin is not an applicant for the circuit judgeship from which T. B. Stuart recently resigned, he has not been an applicant and does not intend to become one.

Thus does Attorney Franklin answer a report from Washington, D. C., which says that, aside from James L. Coke he and C. C. Bitting, former assistant U. S. attorney, are after the bench position.

"As far as I know, I have never been suggested as successor to Judge Stuart," says Franklin. "The way I feel now, I would not consider being an applicant under any circumstances."

Franklin adds that he does not now know whether he would accept the judgeship if it was offered to him. It is thought that local friends may have proposed him either to the president or the attorney-general.

Bitting frankly stated today that he is an applicant for the judgeship and that he has "the very best backing the town affords."

The former assistant U. S. attorney says his letter to the attorney-general was to the effect that, under section 16 of the Organic Act, Coke is ineligible for the appointment because, he adds, this section provides that no member of the legislature shall, during the period following his election, be appointed or elected to any other office of the territory.

Bitting says that courts have held, and authorities have been cited to the attorney-general, that a resignation would not set aside that imperative provision of the Organic Act.

**NEW MAUI CHURCH STONE
 WILL BE LAID TOMORROW**
