

HILO ALL READY FOR CIVIC HOSTS AND VISITORS TO BIG COUNTY FAIR

Committees Prepared to Greet Visitors Arriving at Crescent City

HILO, Sept. 15.—All indications point to a most successful civic convention in Hilo next week and now that the time is fast approaching, the various committees are working overtime to get everything ready for the entertainment of the delegates. Down in Honolulu and over on Maui and Kauai the interest in the big civic gathering is growing keener every day and, judging from the partial lists of the names of the men who are coming to Hilo, there is going to be a record crowd at the gathering.

Governor Coming
Governor Pinkham, who was expected to travel on the U. S. cruiser St. Louis, will not do so. He has wireless Director William McKay saying that he will arrive in company with the rest of the delegates on the Mauna Kea next Thursday morning. The governor will address the convention and it is said that he will have an important announcement to make and one that will be of interest to the whole territory.

The long working period of preparation for the convention is nearly over and next Thursday morning will see the beginning of the end when the good ship Mauna Kea, crowded with good fellows, will steam alongside the Kihio bay wharf, there to be welcomed by a host of Hilo, Kohala and Kona people—a number of the latter are expected to come overland to Hilo so as to be on hand ready to act as hosts to the visitors from the other islands.

County Fair Progresses
Real hard work is now being done by the county fair committee and that energetic director, Dr. Elliot, backed up by that hard-working secretary, E. G. Allen. The whole of the directors are also on the job and Kihio bay wharf now looks like a really busy place. Yesterday morning there arrived the steamer Hamakua, which was specially chartered for a trip from Kawaihae in order to bring a lot of livestock to the county fair. Thirteen fine animals arrived and among

them were cows, mules, horses and bulls. One bull is the splendid specimen that has been purchased by Harold Rice of Maui for the nice little price of \$4000.

Many Exhibits Arrive
The arrival of the Mauna Kea yesterday morning also meant a lot to the fair, for a number of exhibits from the other islands arrived on the Inter-island flagship. These exhibits are being taken care of and placed in the space provided for them.

The committee in charge of the arrangements on the wharf has marked out the space desired by each exhibitor and group of exhibitors. Ample space is being allotted and the passageways between the different stalls and benches will be very wide, thus leaving room for the thousands of visitors to the fair to walk up and down and inspect the exhibits at their leisure.

No Entry Fees
The directors of the fair have decided to do away with all entry fees for exhibits and it will, therefore, cost the exhibitors nothing to place their exhibits. The date for the closing of the entries has also been extended until Wednesday evening next, so that people can enter any article they like up till that late moment. The fair opens on Friday morning, so exhibitors had better get very busy and send in their entries.

Maui Delegates

WAILUKU, Sept. 15.—Delegates to the Fifth Civic Convention from Maui are not to go as "a nondescript crew," as one of the delegates said. The Maui men had always gone before. This decision was reached at a meeting of the delegates held last Wednesday. A uniform, consisting of a white hat, a white shirt, white trousers, white shoes and a tie and sash of the Maui colors—black and yellow—is to be worn by all. Besides the catchy uniform the delegation is to have two or three songs with which to entertain the other delegates. The delegates are to meet tonight at D. H. Case's home to practise the songs. Besides the 12, whose names were published last week, F. B. Cameron and J. Patterson are to be given credentials.

MAUI COUNTY FAIR TO BE GIVEN WITH MANY AMUSEMENT FEATURES

Parades, Concerts and Other Events to Augment Educational Exhibits

WAILUKU, Sept. 15.—Maui's first County Fair is not to be entirely educational, unless teaching one how to have a good time is to be considered under that head. So declares J. Garcia, head of the fair's amusement committee. Like an educational moving picture exhibit for children, there is to be provision made for the amusement at the fair for the old and young children of Maui and visitors of similar inclinations.

Some indication of the amusement feature of the county show was given in a report made to the executive committee by Garcia. There are to be band concerts, dances of all nations, addresses, parades, automobiles and lanterns, and many other things, besides numerous side shows which will be attracted here by the big Maui event.

Garcia thinks that maybe his division of the fair will grow to such proportions that he will have to secure permission from the supervisors to close off one of the streets leading to the baseball grounds in which to place the overflow of concessions.

The entire fair is to be held on the Wailuku baseball grounds, according to a unanimous agreement reached by the fair executive committee, which held a meeting in the town hall on last Monday afternoon. But it was not unanimous decision until the question of space and housing for the exhibits had been thoroughly thrashed out and the executive committee had made a tour of inspection to the grounds.
