

GOVERNOR SAVES JOSE BILINUEVA FROM EXECUTION

Filipino Convicted of Murdering Hawaiian Girl Made Life Termer

In accordance with a recommendation made to him by the attorney general, and following weeks of study which he himself has made on the case, Governor Pinkham today commuted to life imprisonment the death sentence against Jose Bilinueva, Filipino, convicted on a charge of murdering Harriet Kaunane, a school girl of Kohala, Hawaii.

Yesterday afternoon the governor visited Bilinueva and for more than an hour questioned him through an interpreter. For some time it has been known that he has been putting a great deal of study upon the transcript of the evidence, and the visit to Oahu prison yesterday was to convince himself finally that the death sentence should be commuted. The murder was on October 8, 1915.

Find Weak Spots
The recommendation of Attorney General Stalnback, sent recently to the governor, is backed by a general summing up of the case to show so-called "weak spots in the chain of strong circumstantial evidence against the condemned man."

"In view of the unsatisfactory nature of much of the evidence," says the report, "I believe that you will be justified in commutating the sentence to life imprisonment."

Sp's Testimony Discounted
Much of the testimony of Bello Perro, a Filipino police spy, is discounted by the attorney general. Bello was one of the chief witnesses for the prosecution.

"That the girl was killed by a Filipino, we believe almost unquestionably from the character of the crime and the testimony of Ichikawa, a Japanese chauffeur, who was one of the last persons to see Harriet Kaunane alive," says the attorney in going over the testimony.

"His testimony is clear and convincing and probably induced the authorities to make a drag net for Filipinos and between 40 and 60 were arrested, among whom was the condemned man in question."

It is pointed out that the condemned man seems to be of shrewdness and intelligence. He answered to a question as to wearing a bloody shirt that a man who had committed murder would be crazy to go round wearing clothes smeared with blood. No credence is given to testimony by one Bata that Bilinueva confessed to the crime. The two were said to be almost entirely unacquainted.

One interesting suggestion made by the attorney is that the blood of which so many witnesses testified in the case might have been from a rash or itch which the defendant had and still has. It is brought out that this might have bled from the scratching, though such a thing is admitted improbable to any great extent.

there appears to be no reason why it should be.

Scholarship System—"The system has been eliminated for the purported reason that it encouraged loafing on the part of the boys. If this be true then the trouble lay with the authorities who exercised poor supervision. Another reason given for the elimination of the scholarship system was that it kept a bunch of 'loafs' or good-for-nothings in school. That statement is a reflection on the large number of creditable men who have gone through the school with the assistance of the scholarship system; a reflection on the judgment of the trustees who allowed the system to continue for several years."

Visits by Trustees—"In order to get better acquainted it is very desirable to have the trustees visit the schools often. We also recommend that efforts be made by the administration to keep in closer touch with the graduates and non-graduates."
