### OAHU RAILWAY GRANTS ADVANCE TO ITS LABORERS

Request of Japanese Employees Met By Action of Directors Giving Higher Pay

The Oahu Railway & Land Company has advanced the wages of its Japanese laborers, numbering about 300. The new rate of wages is to go into effect this month.

The latter part of last month the Star-bulletin told of the request of 50 Japanese stevedores working on the Ewa side of the railroad wharf, for an advance in wages from \$1.45 to \$1.75 a day. The result of negotiations following were announced by the Company Saturday afternoon. The representatives of the Japanese laborers met several times with Manager George P. Denison of the company and were promised by him that he would bring the matter before the directors' meeting to be held November 2. This he did and sent his answer to the representatives of the Japanese employees Saturday afternoon, in effect that 300 laborers on the Ewa side of the wharf and on all sections of the railroad would receive a higher wage. The new rate will be: For stevedores on Railroad wharf, wages are advanced to \$1.75 a day from \$1.45, and for overtime, 55 cents an hour instead of 30 cents. For railroad section hands wages are advanced to \$1.50 a day from \$1.25. For engineers the advance is to \$2.50 a day from \$2.25 per day.

### MAUI TO HAVE AUTO CLUB

WAILUKU, Maui, Nov. 5.—Maui is to have an auto club shortly, organized along the lines of the Honolulu Auto Club, if the efforts of J. P. Foster of Paia is successful. He brought the question of organizing such a club up at the meeting of the fair committee held yesterday and the plan met with approval from all these present. He said that a number of Paia, Makawao and Hemaunawoko motorists had already discussed the matter and were anxious to see the organization effected, if for no other reason than to urge the better enforcement of the automobile ordinance. The discussion brought out the fact that the motorists themselves were very anxious to see the dimming of auto lights clause in the ordinance enforced, which it was declared had not been the case up to the present.

### JAPAN CLOSES DOORS OF ITS ONLY GERMAN BANK

YOKOHAMA, Japan.—The Yokohama branch of the Deutsch-Asiatische bank has been closed by order of the Japanese government and all its business suspended. This shutting up of the only German bank in Japan will seriously affect German prisoners of war whose deposits formed the largest part of the business. It is estimated that deposits of about 4000 German prisoners are locked up until the official ban on the institution is removed, which will probably not be until the closing of the war. The total deposits by Germans are estimated to be 3,000,000 yen or about \$1,500,000.

### NEW HILO PAPER MAKES ITS FIRST APPEARANCE

Copies of the Hawaii Post, Hilo's new newspaper, have made their appearance in Honolulu. "No. 1, Vol. 1," being dated November 1. It is a four-page, five-column paper and is devoted largely to local news, carrying also some wireless and cable. It promises that its political policy will be independent, favoring legislative reform and home rule.

Both the editor, T. Wake, and the manager of the printing department, R. L. Halbin, are recent comers to Hawaii, having entered the journalistic field here after experience in New Zealand.

### HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS ARE SCARCE IN LONDON

LONDON, England.—Hotel accommodations in London are becoming a serious problem. The government has taken over a number of well known hotels for various war bureaus and two of the largest clubs in the city recently were commandeered. The result of this demand for room has been a marked rise in prices. One of the better hotels, patronized largely by Americans and Canadians, has just announced an increase of 40 per cent in the price of all rooms. Cafe prices are following the upward trend, and the greatest complaint heard is that the size of the portions decreases as rapidly as the price moves upward.


