KOHALA DOCTOR LIKELY TO HAVE LICENSE REVOKED

Health Board Finds Shimamoto Guilty on Three Charges Against Him

In a short meeting of the health board Saturday, following their return from Hawaii, recommendation was made to the territorial treasurer that the license of one U. Shimamoto, a Japanese doctor of Kohala, be revoked at once.

The six members of the board returned Saturday from the Big Island, having held their investigation of the Kohala case last week and become fully satisfied that Shimamoto's license should be taken from him. "Through our investigation," said Dr. J. S. B. Pratt, president of the board, "we are certain that he has treated case after case of tuberculosis without reporting it to the health authorities.

Three charges were brought against the Japanese—unprofessional conduct, gross carelessness and manifest incapacity—on all of which he was found guilty.

"Evidence showed that there was one case of tuberculosis which Shimamoto had treated for stomach trouble; another case where the patient finally died was treated after the sick man had spent three months in the tuberculosis hospital at Hilo."

Dr. Pratt says that there was but one case that he had diagnosed as tuberculosis, and that one was not reported to the authorities. His excuse for this was that the woman patient was intending to go back to Japan and that he did not believe the territory would want the report.

The practitioner has had a license since August, 1915. His "office boy" or assistant, is one Kaneshige, who was twice convicted in Kohala and once in Honolulu for illegal practise of medicine. Dr. Pratt believes that Kaneshige is practising with the other man, but could not find any Japanese who were willing to testify against him.
