BOOZE HELPS TO GET THIS MAN 3 YEARS IN PRISON

"Liquor No Excuse for Crime," Warning to One Who Carved Woman With Knife

It is seldom these days that Circuit Judge Ashford has an opportunity to deliver from the bench his pitiless sermon on the relation of booze to the commission of crime, but this morning he "sweated" one James Kahalewai for five minutes to an extent where it is safe to say that James—if he is wise—will not take a drink for some time to come.

Kahalewai admitted he was "full" when he carved up a young Hawaiian woman and then turned around and assaulted her father with the same weapon, a knife.

"If you had been sober that night this never would have occurred," Judge Ashford opened fire. "And drink is no excuse for crime. You are going to be put away for several years for this, and you may charge up one year to John Barleycorn for having gotten you drunk."

After explaining that, according to testimony, if Kahalewai had cut the woman one-sixteenth of an inch deeper she would have died to death before help came, Judge Ashford sent James to prison for three years.
