DEMOCRATS WILL CLOSE CAMPAIGN AFFAIRS TONIGHT

Murray's Proposed Bond Issue Likely to Form Topic for Discussion

Whether an attack shall be made by the Bourbons on the bond issue project proposed by Harry E. Murray, manager of the sewer and water departments, is likely to come up for discussion at a meeting tonight of the Democratic territorial central committee.
 The meeting will be held in the headquarters of the party, Collins building, and will begin at 7:30 o'clock. The purpose of the meeting is to clear up the business of the recent campaign, in which the Bourbons expended about \$1200.
 "Thus far nothing has been done regarding the proposed bond issue for sewer and water improvements," says Chairman W. A. Bryan, "and it is not on the program for discussion tonight. It is possible, however, that the question may come up."
 Chairman Bryan adds that this matter should rightly come before the county committee and not the central board.

PLANS TO TRAIN GIRLS WILL BE MEETING TOPIC

Central Committee on Child Welfare Calls Public Gathering for Next Monday

Called by the Central Committee on Child Welfare, a public meeting is to be held at the Library of Hawaii next Monday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock to launch a feature of the movement for "babysaving stations," which came to public attention during Honolulu's "Baby Week" a few months ago.

For several years Dr. J. S. E. Pratt, president of the board of health, has been earnestly working to find ways and means whereby the young girls in the city could receive some training on simple facts of caring for babies and children, and preparing themselves for the home duties of mothers later on, including various branches of domestic science. Lately a number of women in local organizations have talked the subject over and the meeting on Monday is the result.

Dr. Pratt will preside and will briefly explain his views and Dr. Adelaide Brown, the San Francisco physician and sanitary expert who is visiting here, has been asked to tell something of what can be accomplished, judging by experience elsewhere.

All women of the community are invited. An invitation is to be extended to the department of public instruction, as one feature of the work may be the training of girls in the schools.

FORBES REPORTS TO GOVERNOR ON HIS DEPARTMENT

Charles R. Forbes, superintendent of public works, today filed with the governor his annual report for the fiscal year ending July 1, 1916. The report is printed in a neat 16-page booklet and illustrated with photographs showing work accomplished by the department during the year. "I would like to draw attention to the showing made in the building of public roads," says the superintendent in his statement to the governor, "possibly the most vital single need of the territory."

"Another most important project is the territorial prison on the island of Oahu. Work on this has moved steadily forward in spite of many minor difficulties and obstacles."

"During the year covered by this report more than \$1,000,000 worth of work has been undertaken by this department in conjunction with the board of harbor commissioners, in carrying on of which the efficient organization of the department has produced most gratifying results."

The booklet contains a frontispiece of the Waiolama canal, Hilo; a picture of the improved streets on Auwalimu tract; Round Top road; territorial prison buildings; territorial marketing division; Walkiki swamps; the Waimea river embankment on Kauai, and several others showing work during the year.

SHRINERS WILL PARADE VICTIMS THROUGH STREETS

The Shriners and their cringing victims will parade through the streets in gay and grotesque garb, going to the skating rink on upper Fort street for their secret ceremonies. In the evening there will be a big banquet at the Moana.

Lester Petrie, head of the famous Alcha temple patrol, is in charge of the "stunts." These Shriner parades are a big feature in Honolulu's city life and always draw a large crowd.
