## Tina Lerner Great Pianiste; Performance Astonishes



TINA LERNER AT THE PIANO

Tina Lerner, Russian pianiste, bowed to a rather small audience at the Opera House last night and gave what many critics felt to be the finest piano recital ever heard in this city.

Her experience may be that of the Cherniavskys, who came here almost unknown to local music lovers, who had a slim house the first night, and on the four performances since then have "packed them in."

Merit did it for the Cherniavskys and merit should do it for Madame Lerner.

She plays with charm, distinction, great beauty of tone and with a good deal of brilliance and fire. Her chief qualities as displayed last night are

wonderful fingering, particularly of the right hand, a polished, suave method and a certain forceful phrasing at times almost masculine.

What Maud Powell is to the violin, Tina Lerner is to the piano—its mistress and its enchanting interpreter.

Therefore she should have a much larger audience next Tuesday night.

It is an axiom in musical circles that only Paderewski can fill houses with an "all-piano program." The great Pole does it because tradition makes him the premier pianoforte artist of the generation. But Tina Lerner gave a program last night which was never tiresome, though it was solely of piano selections.

Most of them were short, vivid, pulsating compositions, several of dazzling brilliance under her remarkable fingers. Liszt's "Campanella" elicited a program which astounded her audience and started them into something approaching real enthusiasm. Few artists have equaled the applause she got from all parts of the house.

A criticism that the name of her piano was so "blatantly displayed as to be almost a snip in the face," has been made. This is Lerner's own piano; she carries it with her, and at all mainland concerts one sees the same thing.

She played with the house lights high and no stage lights. The result was not comfortable for the audience, though it accorded with her own ideas. It emphasized the stage, which is bare and of tawdry scenery because the Opera House is soon to be torn down. Not an unnecessary cent is being spent on it now. Under the circumstances, Honolulu will hardly regret the passing of this famous edifice, for it is now unsuited for any event of society or entertainment.
