PICKPOCKET IS PERMITTED TO GO
The first attempt known to the police of pocket picking in the Carnival crowds brought an immediate arrest and a quick ejection from the territory of the perpetrator.
Wednesday night in Aala park Frank Stillman of the city water works department suddenly felt his purse leaving his pocket. He whirled quickly, caught the pickpocket in the act and called for the police.
Policeman Henry Daniels, on duty in that vicinity, came quickly and took the stranger to the police station. After an investigation he was locked up. Later he got out on \$250 cash bail.
This morning in police court the man, who gives his name as F. A. Kirkpatrick, pleaded guilty and promised to leave the territory on the same boat in which he came, the Great Northern, if given a suspended sentence. This was done. He claims to be a Los Angeles real estate agent.
"There are three in his gang," says Capt. McDuffie of the detectives, "and they all work together. Their scheme is the old-fashioned pickpocket method of surrounding their victim in a crowd and holding him from all sides until his purse is snatched."
Kirkpatrick is an elderly, respectable looking person and under the name of David Richardson threatened the police for locking him up. Later he admitted his right name.
When Kirkpatrick won his freedom with bail two detectives trailed him for some distance. Suddenly the shadowed man took to his heels, running at full speed until he had lost himself in the Carnival crowd.
The pickpocket threw the purse away before he was arrested but it was found later in the grass.

NETTING TO GUARD NEW YORK HARBOR
(Special Star-Bulletin Correspondence)
NEW YORK, N. Y., Feb. 19.—New York harbor is to be guarded from invasion by hostile submarines by an enormous net over two miles long, which will be lowered across the channels entering the harbor, stretching from Sandy Hook to Rockaway Point. Work on the net was begun today in the New York navy yard, on board the old monitor Amphitrite.
In order to hasten the completion of the net orders have been given to send seamen from the receiving ship New Jersey to the Amphitrite. The net probably will be made in sections and lowered in the channel as soon as possible.
The net will be used only at night. In the daytime airplanes, torpedo boat destroyers and a "mosquito fleet" will be relied upon to make it impossible for a hostile U-boat to approach the harbor undetected, and the net will be lowered to permit vessels to pass through. It is understood that similar measures will be taken to protect other harbors along the Atlantic coast.
Netting Proves Effective
Netting has proved effective as a means of defense against submarines and no submarine has yet been able to operate in a British or French harbor. Thousands of miles of heavy netting are in use in English waters, and outside the German coast they have been stretched for the entanglement of submarines.
While the Germans assert that they have perfected a device for cutting nets which enables them to escape when their submarines are entangled, no undersea craft has yet been able to hack its way through the British harbor defenses, and it is understood that they avoid encounters with nets wherever possible even if they are sometimes able to extricate themselves.

CARNIVAL TIME AT HEINIE'S
Heinie's Tavern, "on the beach at Waikiki," has proved the most popular place of amusement in Honolulu during the Carnival. Last night, as all previous nights for the past few weeks, Heinie's has experienced the gayest and largest crowds of the year. THINKS IT FINE FUN TO EXPLODE BALLOONS; MAY YET BE ARRESTED
The police are making a double investigation of a story that a well known young Honolulu engaged in the exciting pastime of blowing up a little Carnival merchant's whole supply of balloons on the streets and that a policeman on the spot failed to arrest the miscreant and bring him to the station.
An eye-witness says the little fellow's whole supply went up like smoke as a sacrifice to the other's whim and that a bystander who stepped in to learn the reason for the little boy's tears was nearly assaulted by the one who had caused all the row.
The story goes that a policeman on duty nearby came up and attempted to arrest the fellow but was "buffaloed" out of it by the belligerent attitude of the near-prisoner's friends.
