## COULD NOT AVOID STRIKING CHUB, IS NOTTINGHAM'S BELIEF

Deeply regretting the accident which has laid up Sgt. R. Chub of the 25th Infantry with a broken leg, J. E. Nottingham does not see how he could have avoided the accident. Chub and other soldiers were, he says, attempting to cross the street, not a corner but in mid-block, where a driver does not expect to meet pedestrians, and he did not see them when passing a truck until he was right upon Chub. He denies that he was speeding, but considers it fortunate that he struck Chub a glancing blow with a wheel, rather than to have caught him full on, in which event the accident might have been fatal, he thinks. The only criticism he has to make is that Chub and those with him were attempting to cross the street at another point than a corner. He says that E. Latimer, who was in the car with him, will corroborate what he, Nottingham, has said in regard to the accident.

Nottingham is assistant staff representative for the Argonaut and is an experienced driver, having been licensed as a driver for the past eight years.

## BRITISHER SUNK IN WAR ZONE; MANY MISSING

(Associated Press by Federal Wireless) LONDON, Eng., Feb. 23.—The British steamer John Mills has been sunk, according to the announcement here last night. Four members of her crew, badly injured by the explosion of the torpedo that destroyed the vessel and two killed by the explosion, have been landed. The remainder of the crew is missing, says the Central News Agency.

## MONTANA HOUSE PASSES 8-HOUR LAW FOR LABOR

HELENA, Mont.—The Montana house of representatives has passed an eight-hour labor law, establishing the eight-hour day for all public employees and for all employees of mines, quarries, smelters, saw mills, sugar works and other factories. The bill now goes to the senate.
