STOCK PRICES TEND UPWARD

Slightly upward tendency was to be seen in listed securities at the session of the exchange this morning following a holiday. The volume of business was about as it has been during Carnival, below recent days' averages. Sales between boards were 525 and at the session 260.

McBryde, after selling at 10 1/4, rose an eighth, Hawaiian Commercial rose a quarter from 49 and Pineapples three-eighths to 49 3/4. Other sales were Ewa 32, Waiatua 30 1/4 and Olan 15.

Unlisted securities were a shade lower in some instances. Mineral Products was unchanged at 85 cents, as was Mountain King at 33 cents, Montana-Bingham was 45 cents and Madeira 29 and 28 cents. There were no sales of Engels Copper, nor of Oil, the former being quoted 7 1/2 and 7 1/4, and the latter at \$3.20 and \$3.45.

CITY ENGINEER'S ORDERS NOW STOP CUTTING OF TREES

Supervisor Hatch Sheds New and Much-Needed Light on Kapiolani Park Incident

Orders from the city engineer to the Spalding Construction Company to stop cutting the Kapiolani Park ironwood trees, temporarily at least, and a statement and questions by Supervisor Hatch, which put entirely new phases on the tree-cutting incident, were important developments today.

When W. T. Spalding, manager of the Spalding Construction Company, was seen this morning by Judge Hatch, who asked him not to cut the ironwood trees, Spalding said he had already received orders from the city and county engineer not to cut the trees and had no intention of destroying them.

GOVERNMENT LOOKS AFTER DEPENDENTS OF DROWNED SAILORS

Territorial Secretary Wade Warren Thayer has handed to Speaker H. L. Holstein a copy of a letter from the secretary of the navy relating to H. R. 114, session of 1915, petitioning Congress to enact legislation for the relief of dependent survivors of the crew of the submarine F-4, lost in Honolulu bay.

The letter from the secretary of the navy, originally addressed to the secretary of the interior, follows:

"I beg to acknowledge the receipt of a copy of resolution adopted by the legislature of the territory of Hawaii petitioning Congress to enact legislation for the relief of dependent survivors of the crew of the submarine F-4.

"Dependent survivors of the crew of the F-4 already have been paid by this department, under death benefit law covering such cases, six months' pay of the deceased officer or man upon whom the beneficiary was dependent, and the pension laws undoubtedly will operate to give pensions to dependent relatives under the customary procedure."

GERMAN HELD FOR INVESTIGATION

The German stowaway aboard the Sheridan, of whom mention was made in the Star-Bulletin when the transport was here early in the month, is being held in San Francisco for investigation and on suspicion of being a spy. An account of his arrival and detention is contained in the San Francisco Chronicle of February 14, which says:

An investigation was begun last night by secret service operatives into the identity and past actions of George Kieft, a German who arrived here yesterday on the United States transport Sheridan from Manila as a stowaway. Kieft was taken off the transport shortly after the vessel arrived in the harbor and is held in detention at Angel island.

Incriminating papers, which, it is alleged, show that Kieft is a German spy and disbursting agent, were found in a trunk which he smuggled aboard the transport at Manila when he stowed away.

Mingled With Soldiers
Dressed in the uniform of a United States private, Kieft boarded the Sheridan at Manila and mingled with the soldiers in the troops' quarters. His presence was not discovered until several days after the vessel left port, when the soldiers aboard were ordered to muster and it was found that there was one too many. Kieft acknowledged that he had purchased the uniform and that he was a German.

Kieft told the officer that he was out of funds and wished to get to San Francisco. He was searched and \$672 was found secreted in his clothes. Shortly afterwards a large steamer trunk and a suit case belonging to Kieft were found hidden in a secluded place.

His Trunk is Searched
The trunk was searched and, according to one of the army officers traveling on the Sheridan as a passenger, disclosed papers showing that Kieft was in the employ of the German government. Receipts for money paid to Germans in the Philippines and papers showing he had received money from the German government, together with other evidence showing that he was a German agent, were discovered, according to the officer.

Col. John T. Knight, general superintendent of the transport service, said last night:

"I was notified officially that Kieft was aboard, and as he was an alien the immigration authorities have jurisdiction and he was sent to Angel island on the army tug. I heard no more."

DEUTSCHLAND NOT A CAPTIVE; BREMEN SUNK IN STORM, SAYS REPORT

COPENHAGEN, Denmark, Feb. 23.—The German merchant submarine Bremen was not captured on its first trip to the United States but was sunk in a terrific storm in the Atlantic ocean, will on her way to America, according to reliable information that has been in the hands of the Associated Press for many months. The Berlin office of the Associated Press was in possession of this information for some time but it was able to transmit it to this city only yesterday.

The same advices state that the merchant submarine Deutschland, sister-ship of the Bremen, is now engaged in supplying the war divers that are carrying on Germany's campaign of ruthless submarine warfare.

It is reported that at least six sister ships of the Deutschland and Bremen, large cargo-carrying submarines, are cooperating in this work of transporting food, supplies and munitions to the U-boats in the Atlantic that are conducting the unrestricted warfare against shipping passing to and from England, France and Belgium through the "barred zone."

A new munitions factory in Canada has a waiting list of 700 women who are anxious to work.

Argentina and Brazil are experimenting in the manufacture of dyes from native woods and other sources with apparently good prospects of success.
