

# Shipping & Waterfront News

## GREAT NORTHERN TAKES BIG LIST

With the United States on the verge of war, the Great Northern, the morning of April 2, took for San Francisco was in the hands of the Pacific because of the coast of actual war, which now seems not more than 24 hours away. The liner will become a war vessel and will probably be used as a troop ship.

## ODOBOOS ONIONS FILL UP SIERRA

The status of the steamer Sierra when she arrived from Sydney and Pago Pago at 11:30 this morning, docking at Pier No. 10, was to San Francisco at a week. This afternoon, taking all night, accumulated from the time of Great Northern, which was despatched 132 bags left at 11 this morning.

# LIBBOSER BOAT AT HILO AGAIN

Hilo, April 2.—There sailed from Hilo for San Francisco yesterday last a famous boat, which has been mentioned in news items all over the world during the past several years. The schooner, Ann Larsen, of gun running fame, and so closely connected with the name of the late Governor, is now alongside Kaho Bay wharf. But the schooner this time is laden with gunnery, and is being taken to the coast of California by the company. The vessel is from South ports and she took 20 days to make the trip down.

The schooner was under the command of Captain Olsen when she was in the gun running trade. He was a brother of Captain Olsen, who came to Hilo as commander of the steamer Mavorick and who died in the Orient shortly after he left Java, where he had taken the Mavorick to the coast of Java. The movements of the schooner from the time she left Hilo for Java were very closely watched by Japanese and British warships, and the steamer was never out of the sight of some of the Allied cruisers.

## MAUI SCHEDULE FROM MAINLAND

The new Matson flagship Maui will pay a call to the people of the Valley Island on her maiden voyage became known yesterday when a telegram was received by Manager John H. Drew of the shipping department of Castle & Cooke, the Matson Navigation Company, giving the schedule for her first voyage. It is as follows:

Leave San Francisco Saturday, April 7; arrive Honolulu Thursday, April 12, probably in the afternoon; leave Honolulu Saturday, April 14; arrive Kahului Sunday morning, April 15; leave Kahului Sunday night, April 15; arrive Hilo Monday morning, April 16; leave Hilo Tuesday afternoon, April 17; return to Honolulu Wednesday morning, April 18; leave Honolulu for San Francisco Thursday, April 19, at 10 a. m.

The Maui's schedule for the first voyage from San Francisco here is one day less than the Matson's. It is believed that the Maui will arrive late in the afternoon, as did the Matson on her maiden voyage in 1912, when she made the distance in five days instead of the six she is allowed by her present schedule.

The message adds that it is expected the liner will be well filled with passengers when she leaves San Francisco.

Repairs to the Inter-Island steamer Hamakua ordered recently by the local U. S. inspectors of hulls and boilers are being pushed hard and day at the Inter-Island drydock, as the company needs the vessel badly to handle freight awaiting shipment at ports on the Big Island. The Maui's wreck is the reason why work on her is being speeded up. It was begun before the Inter-Island steamer plid up on the reef March 29.
