AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE LOCATION AND ESTABLISHMENT OF CURB LINES AND GRADES UPON BERETANIA STREET, FROM ALAPAI STREET TO PUNAHOU STREET, IN THE DISTRICT OF HONOLULU, CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU, TERRITORY OF HAWAII.

Be it Ordained by the People of the City and County of Honolulu: SECTION 1. CURB LINES. That the curb lines of Beretania Street, from Alapai Street to Punahou Street, within the limits of "Frontage Improvement Number Nine," Beretania Street, are hereby established as shown on the plans set forth on Sheets 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 respectively of Grade Map No. 20, dated July 3, 1917, and authenticated by the signature of the City and County Engineer, on file and of record in the Office of the City and County Engineer, herein specifically incorporated by reference.

SECTION 2. CURB GRADES. That the curb grades of Beretania Street, from Alapai Street to Punahou Street, within the limits of "Frontage Improvement Number Nine," Beretania Street, are hereby established as shown on the plan and profile set forth on Sheets 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 respectively of Grade Map No. 20, dated July 3, 1917, hereinbefore specifically referred to and incorporated.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect from and after the date of its approval.
