

PORTLAND DRY, LACKS TENANTS FOR CITY JAIL

PORTLAND, Ore.--There was only one man in the city jail of Portland when Sheriff William Gormley visited the metropolis of Oregon last week, and he was wanted in Sacramento, says the Sacramento Union of a recent date. His name was George L. Latham and he was wanted here on a bigamy charge. He returned with the sheriff.

"Oregon is bone dry now, and I guess that was the reason for the absence of guests in the city jail of Portland," said Sheriff Gormley. "On Saturday, Latham was the only man in custody and on Sunday and Monday there were only four or five more brought in. Not a one was a drunk, and Portland claims 250,000 people." Last Sunday there were 14 drunks and nine drug users booked by the police in Sacramento.

The sheriff told of the prosperity that exists in Portland with an excessive demand for labor in the lumber and shipbuilding industries. He said that the city appeared prosperous, with two magnificent bank buildings just completed and a fine federal building going up.

The opening of Portland's rose festival this year was a unique occasion. There was not a rose in the city when the affair started last Wednesday. A backward season had cut off the blooms but thousands of people came in from the surrounding country and they went right ahead, using paper flowers instead, according to Gormley.
