BELGIAN ENVOYS PRAISE
SHOWING OF NEW UNITS

(Associated Press by U. S. Naval Commu-
nication Service)
SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, July 18.—
Members of the Belgian mission, now
touring the West, reviewed one of the
new regiments organized here a few
weeks ago, which has had only one
month of drill. After complimenting
the men on the appearance they pre-
sented, one of the military members
of the mission stated that the pro-
gress made by this regiment in a
month justified him in a belief that
such men could be safely put into the
field four months after being recruit-
ed. The progress indicated, he said,
gave the members of the Belgian mis-
sion great hopes of what the Ameri-
can forces would be able to do in
Europe before Christmas.
