## FACTIONAL WAR IN CHURCH AGAIN GROWING BITTER

Pastor Parker From Pulpit Refuses to Recognize Meeting Called to Select Successor

Once more the Kawaiahao church row is coming to the front. This time, Rev. H. H. Parker, pastor of the church, questions authority of a certain member of the church, presumably J. K. Kamanoulu, to call a special meeting tonight for the purpose of considering asking the pastor to call a general meeting of all the members of the church two weeks from next Sunday, according to the terms of the handbook in regard to church matters for the selection of a new pastor for the church.

Last Saturday Mr. Kamanoulu announced that a special meeting would be held tonight in the church for this purpose. During the services yesterday Mr. Parker declared from the pulpit that such an announcement was absolutely unauthorized, and that whoever made such an announcement was "butting in" on another man's affairs.

Mr. Kamanoulu, seen today, was determined to hold a meeting, irrespective of Mr. Parker's announcement. It is generally believed that the church tonight will not be open for this special meeting.

With the announcement by Mr. Parker about a week ago that he would resign the pastorate of the church at the end of this year, Mr. Kamanoulu and others are seriously thinking of calling Rev. Akaiko Akana of the Young People's League, to succeed the veteran pastor of the church. The Parker faction, it is reported, is in favor of Rev. Henry Judd. The pillage between the two factions, it is predicted, will eventually result in the breaking away of members from the church. Some of the oldest members, on this account, have joined other churches in the city. Already a petition is out asking Mr. Parker to reconsider his resignation.
