ROULERS HEAVILY BOMBED

Arsenal Is Destroyed While Machine Guns Rake Regiment as It Flees Burning Building; Airdomes in Two Other Towns Destroyed

London, Oct. 16.—England today launched its vigorous air raiding policy on military positions held by the Germans. Dozens of strategic points in Flanders and Belgium held by the enemy were visited by battalions of machines which dropped tons of explosives on them.

SUN REVOLUTION IN CHINA IS FAST GAINING HEADWAY

(Special Cable to Nippon Jiji) TOKIO, Japan, Oct. 16.—A new revolution in China is fast assuming shape and the situation in the troubled republic is becoming more and more alarming.

Gen. Count Terauchi, premier of Japan, this morning hurriedly called his ministry into conference and the Chinese situation was thoroughly discussed.

The new revolution, launched by Dr. Sun Yat Sen, famous Chinese liberal and other leaders of the so-called South element, against the North element, as represented by Gen. Tuan Chi Jui, premier of China, is making a fair headway.

PROMINENT CHINESE HELD TO BE MAN WITHOUT A COUNTRY

Wong Hing Chow, Naturalized in Days of Monarchy, Refused Admittance to Territory on Ground He Is an Expatriate Because He Lived Seven Years in China

It has been held by the immigration department that persons who were citizens of Hawaii became naturalized citizens of the United States with annexation, but one proposition, claimed by attorneys, to be an unfortunate one, is that if any such naturalized citizen goes to any foreign country and stays there five years without furnishing the American consul with evidence of his desire to remain a subject of America, he then becomes "a man without a country."

The meeting was brief, lasting only while a steamer could take on luggage and passengers, but it was long enough for an exchange of addresses and photographs to be made.

On the same boat was a Y. W. C. A. secretary, who, observing the girl, became convinced of her lack of knowledge of the world and its ways, engaged her in conversation and was soon told the tender secret. From that hour the Y. W. C. A. secretary became the self-appointed guardian of the girl, and, on reaching Honolulu, there being no eager lover on the wharf to welcome his fiancée, took her to the home on King street, where she was put under the personal care of the superintendent.
