

TELEGRAPHIC ITEMS

The Shamrock II. will enter the first yacht race as the favorite.

The case of Mrs. Botkin is before the United States Supreme Court.

Fifty thousand troops guard the czar of Russia during his Paris visit.

Americans have invested a half million dollars in British Columbia copper mines.

American capitalists are seeking to control the lumber trade of British Columbia.

The Japanese government is planning to place a loan of 50,000,000 yen in America.

Many thousands viewed the remains of the dead President as they lie in state at Buffalo.

Every naval officer on active list in Washington will take part in the funeral of President McKinley.

Signs of mourning are displayed all over Europe as a mark of sympathy for the martyred President.

Ex-governor Altgeld of Illinois will defend Czolgosz, the assassin of President McKinley when his case comes to trial.

Mrs. McKinley is in a state of collapse and it is feared that she will not be able to go through the funeral ordeal before her.

The Schley Court of inquiry adjourned one week out of respect to Pres. McKinley. The international Yacht race is also postponed.

The death certificate of the late President gives direct cause of death, "Gangrene of both walls of stomach and pancreas following gun-shot wound."

President McKinley left a will and leaves the bulk of his property to Mrs. McKinley. It is reported that President McKinley carried insurance amounting to over \$200,000.

Admiral Howison was disqualified from serving as a member of the Schley court of inquiry on the ground of bias. Rear Admiral Francis M. Ramsay has been selected as Howison's successor.

Senator Frye of Maine will preside over the deliberations of the United States senate until a new Vice President is chosen at the next general election and has taken the oath of office March 4 1905.

President McKinley, speaking at Buffalo, said America must increase her mercantile marine, build the Isthmian Canal, construct a Pacific cable and pursue a policy of commercial reciprocity.

The Chinese troops have again entered Peking, and the last of the allies have marched out. The Japanese and the American troops received the Chinese, and were thanked for protecting the palaces.

The great steel strike, which began June 30th, was brought to an end at a conference between the leaders of the Amalgamated Association and officers of the subsidiary companies of the United States Steel Corporation on Sept. 14. An agreement was signed under which the men returned to work in the mills that have been idle.

It is a singular coincidence that the day selected for the burial of the late President McKinley at Canton, O., will be the anniversary of the death of President Garfield at Elberon, N. J., twenty years ago. Guitau shot his victim July 2, 1881, but death did not come to the relief of President Garfield until shortly before mid night Friday, September 19, 1881. President Lincoln was shot by the assassin, Booth, on Good Friday night, April 14, 1865, but was unconscious from the time the bullet entered his brain until he breathed his last Saturday morning, April 15, 1865. President McKinley was shot Friday September 6, 1901, and the change for the worse in his condition came Friday morning Sept. 13, 1901.
