TELEGRAPHIC ITEMS

Winter storms of sleet and snow prevailed in New York, Dec. 3.
Senators Perkins and Hale have introduced Pacific Cable bills.
A deluge of Chinese Exclusion bills have been introduced into congress.
The aggregate of unemployed laborers in Germany amounts to 500,000 men.
The English papers generally comment favorably on President Roosevelt's message.
The report of the Isthmian Canal Commission to congress favors the the Nicaragua route.
A race riot is raging at Opp, Alabama, caused by the killing of two white men by a negro.
The British War Secretary, W. St. John Brodrick, is vigorously prosecuting army reform schemes.
Miss Stone, the missionary, is kept concealed in the vicinity of Riloh, near Dabultra, in Bulgarian territory.
Senator Burrows of Michigan has introduced an anti-anarchist bill, putting restriction on immigration.
Henry J. Flishman, cashier of the Farmers and Merchants' Bank, has absconded with \$150,008 of the bank's funds.
A huge gorilla escaped from a circus at Seaford, Delaware, and is terrorizing the inhabitants of that district.
The Schley commission has about finished its report, which will be practically a vindication of Admiral Schley.
"Roosevelt at San Juan Hill" is to be the subject of a painting by Vassili Verstchagen, the famous painter of battle scenes.
Nearly three thousand bills and resolutions were introduced in the House of the Representatives on the first day of the session.

An English lady claims to have been cured of cancer by an application of crushed violet leaves and prominent physicians will test the remedy.
The Interior Department will send a hydraulic engineer to the Hawaiian Islands, to investigate the conservation of the water supply.
Senator Lodge has introduced a bill placing duties on goods imported from the Philippine Islands, to offset the recent Supreme Court decision.
Dr. Williamson, president of the San Francisco Board of Health states that there have been 60 cases of bubonic plague in that city since March 9, 1900.
Japanese poachers are committing heavy depredations on the seal herds in Alaskan waters, and it is feared that the seal fishing will soon cease to be profitable.
