TELEGRAPHIC ITEMS

Rear Admiral Sampson has been placed on the retired list.

California has been visited by a general snow storm in the citrus belt.

Prominent Dutch officials are using their influence to end the Boer troubles.

Continued captures of small bodies of Boers are being reported by Lord Kitchener.

Governor Taft declares that conditions in the Philippine Islands are promising.

Judge Wickersham, of Tacoma, has been appointed to succeed Judge Noyes of Alaska.

The republican leaders are planning to making a sweeping reduction in the war taxes.

The German government was defeated in committee in a vote on the tariff amendment.

Much ill feeling was displayed in the senate during the discussion of the Philippine bill.

There is a possibility of another naval conflict between the Colombian and revolutionary forces.

The Prince of Wales is reported to have met a very cool reception during his recent visit to Germany.

An earthquake is said to have caused the breaking off of the peak of one of the Olympic mountains in Washington.

The celebrated St. Paul Monastery on Mount Athos, Greece, was recently burned, and nine monks perished in the flames.

The Santa Fe system has decided to establish an archeological museum at Albuquerque, as a unique method of attracting travel.

The Mexican cities of Monterey, Chihuahua, Durango and Tampico are planning to obtain \$4,000,000 from Carnegie, to establish libraries.

East Boston was vaccinated one day recently. 125 physicians were employed who made house to house visits, and over 15,000 were vaccinated.

Krueger has received fresh invitations from Chicago, New York and Philadelphia to visit those cities, and will probably start on an American tour in April.

It is reported that there was a very heavy loss of cattle in Nebraska and Oklahoma during the recent blizzard, the thermometer dropping to 25 degrees below zero during the storm.

The Emperor of China has ordered Admiral Yeh to organize a naval college at Chefoo, and to engage Rear Admiral Lord Charles Boreford to act as naval instructor at the college.

A large amount of dynamite stored underground in the heart of New York City recently exploded, killing 3 people, injuring over 100 and destroying or badly damaging several large buildings.

Daniel Coit Gilman, at one time president of the University of California, and since of the John Hopkins University, has been elected president of the Carnegie Institution at Washington, D. C.

The two submarine torpedo boats, the Pike and the Grampus which are being built at the Union Iron Works in San Francisco for the United States Navy are about completed and will be given trial trips at once.

Reporters at the wireless telegraph stations at the Lizard and Isle of Wight interviewed Signor Marconi, while the steamer Philadelphia, on which he was coming to England from the United States, was ten hours distant.

By a vote of 8 to 7, the House Committee has decided in favor of the Government construction, operation and maintenance of a Pacific cable from the coast of California to Hawaii and the Philippines via Midway and the island of Guam.
