



TELEGRAPHIC ITEMS

Jeffries refuses to fight Bob Fitzsimmons in England, but will fight him in California.

An American woman has given \$200,000 for the founding of a French normal school in Chicago.

Queen Wilhelmina of Holland is improving, and it is not probable that a regent will be appointed.

British troops are held in readiness to proceed to Soudan, as trouble is threatening in that part of Egypt.

King Edward has conferred the Victorian order upon Prof. Vambery of Budapest, a famous Hungarian.

It is claimed that C. B. Hadley, accused of the murder of Nora Fuller, has been seen in Victoria, B. C.

Plans are being perfected to construct a railway tunnel under Behring straits, a distance of twenty miles.

A band of 30 Bulgarian troops recently invaded Romelia, but were subsequently driven out by Turkish troops.

Dr. Denby, an American, has been commissioned by Prince Ching to build water works for the city of Peking.

A court-martial has been ordered for the trial of General Jacob H. Smith, for cruelties practiced toward the Filipinos.

The Moros of Mindanao are making more trouble, and an active campaign against them will probably be inaugurated shortly.

It is reported that Carnegie will endow the Western University of Pennsylvania, so as to make it rank with Chicago and Stanford.

Governor Murphy of Arizona has resigned and he will be succeeded by Alexander O. Brodie, second in command of the Rough Riders.

General Funston emphatically denies that he ever used the "water-cure" in the Philippines to torture confessions from the Filipinos.

It is rumored that a new shipping combine, with the Cunard line as a nucleus, will be formed to fight the Morgan Transatlantic combine.

Recent earthquakes in Guatemala have destroyed half a dozen towns and 200 lives have been lost, mostly women, and many others injured.

The melting snows at Klondike have furnished water for sluicing, and it is estimated that at least \$30,000,000 will be cleaned up this season.

Bubonic plague has broken out among the kangaroos (wallaby) at the zoological gardens in Sidney, which have been closed in consequence.

The women of Chicago have organized an Anti Beef-Trust League, the members of which pledge themselves to buy or eat no more meat "till the snow flies."

Governor-General Wood of Cuba has pardoned Reeves who was convicted of complicity in the Cuban postal frauds, Reeves having turned state's evidence.

Roosevelt favors a pan-American railway, and recommends an appropriation of \$200,000 to pay commissioners, who are to be appointed by the president, to visit Central and South America for the purpose of furthering the project.

The House Committee on Naval Affairs has included in the naval appropriation bill, items for the construction of six monster naval vessels, as follows: two battle ships, 16,000 tons each, two armored cruisers, 14,500 tons each and two gunboats of 1,000 tons each.

Judge Van Horn, an attorney of Salt Lake City, has been appointed Judge of the Court of First Instance, at Cairo, Egypt. The position is an international one maintained by the various maritime governments, and passes on questions arising out of Suez Canal traffic, and kindred questions.
