TELEGRAPHIC ITEMS

The best sugar people are getting ready to fight the Cuban treaty.

Commandants Kritzing, Joubert and Fouche have sailed for New York.

Congress will pass the bill to establish the gold standard in the Philippines.

Emperor William has invited Coquelin, the French actor, to join the next court hunt.

The price of silver is lower than ever known before, and still has a downward tendency.

The Crown Prince of Siam left San Francisco for Vancouver, whence he sails for the Orient.

Sheriff Durbin of Indiana has been ousted from office for failing to prevent the lynching of Dillard.

An enormous mortality is reported in the French army, owing chiefly to typhoid and consumption.

A violent eruption of Soufriere crater, the fifth big eruption since May 7, broke out November 26.

James Gordon Bennett and Marquis de Dion are building a steerable flying machine, planned by the latter.

Mrs. Krupp has given \$850,000 to establish a benefit fund for workmen at Essen in memory of her late husband.

The construction of the Russian rail road to the Persian frontier will be commenced at the beginning of the new year.

119 students of Northwestern University at Evanston, Ill. refused to be vaccinated and have been suspended.

James Stillman president of the National City Bank of New York has Presented Harvard with \$100,000 to endow a professorship in comparative anatomy.

Turkey is spending millions in the purchase of guns, rifles and equipments in preparation for a possible outbreak in Macedonia.

Dr. Floyd Clendenin, of La Salle, Illinois, announces that he has discovered a positive cure for cancerous growths of all natures.

The Dowager Empress has decided to appoint Prince Chun to be the principal representative of China at the St. Louis Exposition.

Our Pacific naval fleet is to be mobilized at Santa Barbara, Cal., for target practice and winter maneuvers in Santa Barbara channel.

The will of Herr Krupp leaves his factory to his eldest daughter, Bertina, and also leaves \$250,000 to be devoted to the improvement of Essen.

Crowlright Schreiner, husband of Olive Schreiner, candidate of the Afrikander Bund, has been elected a member of the House of Assembly for Colesburg, Cape Colony.

The British War Office is receiving bitter Australian complaints because the army orders deny war medals and gratuity to troops landed in South Africa after May 21st last.

The British Board of Agriculture has closed ports of United Kingdom against importation of animals from Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Connecticut and Rhode Island.

American capitalists have purchased 1 million acres of Mexican territory along the border line at a cost of \$21,000,000 for the purpose of establishing the largest cattle-raising ranch in the world.

The constabulary is carrying on an aggressive campaign against the Ladrones and fanatics in the northern part of the Island of Leyte. Fifty-two rebels were killed in two fights. No American casualties.

Many Waziris killed, 202 taken prisoners, two wounded, fifty-nine towers and three villages destroyed and 6,000 head of cattle and 680 guns captured as result of British expedition against rebellious tribesmen. Effect of punishment said to have been salutary.
