

TELEGRAPHIC ITEMS

Recent blizzards in Texas caused a loss to stockmen of half a million dollars.

Ira D. Sankey, the famous gospel singer, has been stricken with blindness.

The Kaiser will visit the King of Italy in May, and the Czar in November.

Cattle perished by thousands in the Middle West during the recent cold spell.

There is a serious strike on the Canadian Pacific. The water front is tied up.

A heavy fog spread over New York harbor, March 8, entirely impeding traffic.

Frank P. Sargent, chief of the Bureau of Immigration will visit the Islands in April.

Recent telegrams to Honolulu indicate that the transport service is to be abandoned.

Pope Leo has quite recovered from the illness incident to his reception of the Jubilee guests.

The Honolulu and Manila cable will probably be completed and in operation by the first of May.

The revolutionists in Venezuela are gaining such foothold that the outlook is becoming serious.

An agreement has been reached to take the final vote on the Panama Canal Treaty next Tuesday.

Ex-president Cleveland states in an interview that he has entirely withdrawn from active politics.

A dispatch from Fez states that the rebels have defeated the Moorish army and captured their camp.

The president has renominated Dr. Crum, the colored physician, for Collector of the Port at Charleston.

Wireless telegraphy is to be established between Chicago and Kansas City, by the Armour Packing Co.

A fire destroyed \$600,000 worth of business buildings along the city front at Portland, Ore., Mar. 10.

The famous Mount Vesuvius is again becoming active, and is throwing up ashes and explosive globules.

Bob Fitzsimmons and Jack O'Brien have been matched for a fight at San Francisco during the summer months.

Soldiers have been ordered to protect the health authorities at Mazatlan from a mob who object to plague precautions.

Turkey is preparing for war and the Turkish minister of War is reported to be buying munitions of war in Germany.

Fire broke out in the hold of the S. S. Arizonan at Tacoma, which has delayed the sailing of the steamer for several days.

Heavy earthquakes are reported from many parts of the Island of Santo Domingo, and volcanic outbreaks are feared.

James H. Blount, Cleveland's Paramount Commissioner to Hawaii died of lung trouble at his home in Macon, Georgia, last Sunday.

Great Britain and Russia have opened negotiations to reach an amicable understanding over the conflict of their interests in Persia and elsewhere in the East.

The flood season along the Mississippi is spreading disaster throughout the upper course of the river. The water is raising over the low lands, and hundreds are homeless.

It has been decided that the small complement of American troops now in Cuba shall remain indefinitely to care for the Bahio Hondo and Guantanamo stations, ceded to the United States.

The trial trip of the submarine torpedo boat Grampus, built by the Union Iron Works, in San Francisco, was successfully made on March 9, and it is probable that she will be purchased by the U. S. Government.
