er to first Kruger strikes out.

Third Inning—Delorie out, pitcher to first. Cusack walks after a little footlight performance; he is out stealing second on throw by catcher. Hampton up; he gets his base on ball. Cogswell up; he knocks a daisy down left but it is a foul by half a foot. Cogswell hits to third, who touches out Hampton running there. Maile to bat; Cogswell is out, third to first, lovely pick-up. Smith succumbs to pitcher. J. Garcia puts a safety into left field Morris up; Garcia is finished by catcher's throw, stealing second.

Fourth Inning—Roberts base hits to left. Grady up; Roberts moves along on a pass ball; Grady out pitcher to first, a splendid stop by the former, who gets it mostly on his leg. Davis brings home Roberts on hot left field swipe, Davis reaching second. Desha knocks to short and Davis is home. Ryan slaps hard to right and Desha is over the rubber. Delorie fetches home Ryan on a crack secondward. Cusack knocks centerward and Delorie is on second; Delorie and Cusack move along by clever stealing. Hampton biffs down center and two men are home. Cogswell hits to second and Hampton is caught there. Roberts hits to short, who flings to second and Cogswell is out. Score 6 to 1 for the Mailes. Maile to bat; Morris plays a ball close to the rubber and is out by catcher's pass to first. N. Kruger gets base on balls, he is out stealing second. A Garcia out, second to first.

Fifth Inning—Grady walks gracefully. Davis is up; "Lucy" does a neat sliding act and is safe on second; Davis hits to short, who throws out Lucy off second. Desha safe on short's error Ryan flies to catcher. Delorie is out to left field by the rainbow route Maile to bat; Jackson, the barefoot boy, strikes out. Espindar out, second to first. Tommy Kruger up he walks. Crowell strikes out.

Sixth Inning—Cusack base hits to third. Hampton up; Cusack caught off base by pitcher's throw; Hampton puts a safety infield for first, but he is caught off that base by pitcher's quick eye and hot throw. Cogswell flies to left. Maile to bat; Roberts goes in the box for the Mailes. Smith out, Roberts to Cogswell. J. Garcia base hits to right. Morris flies to second. N. Kruger gets his base. A. Garcia strikes out.

Seventh Inning—Roberts is hit and takes his base. Grady thumps the sphere down center and is safe. Davis up; runners move to second and third on passed ball; Davis gets a walk. Desha up and bases full; he flies to catcher. Ryan flies to left. Delorie bunts to first and is cut easy. Maile batting; Jackson safe on Grady's error. Espindar up; he hits to second, who throws to short, who puts out Jackson at second. T. Kruger up; Espindar steals; Kruger strikes out. Crowell walks. Smith strikes out.

Eighth Inning—Cusack is hit in the back of the neck and is allowed his base. Hampton safe on whack to right. Cogswell lands an infielder and two men come home on pitcher's fumbling and subsequent handling of the globe; Cogs reaches second and then steals third. Grady fetches home Scissors, assisted by short error. Davis up; Grady steals second. Davis strikes out. Grady home on Desh's safety over short's head. Ryan safe on hit to short. Delorie up; Ryan steals second. Desha comes home put pitcher nabs Delorie. Score 11 to 1. Maile up; Desha pitching. J. Garcia out, short to first. Morris safe on first's error. N. Kruger up; Morris steals; Kruger flies to second. A. Garcia sends a liner into second's hands.

Ninth Inning—Delorie strikes out. Cusack out, second to first. Hampton is finished, short to first. Maile up; Jackson strikes out. Espindar hits to first and dies. T. Kruger walks. Crowell up; he also walks. Smith up and dies in effort to register at first. Score by Innings—
