TO ASSIST THE FARMERS.

A letter to Hon. H. P. Baldwin has been received from Jared G. Smith, Director of the Experiment Station in Honolulu announcing his willingness to assist the farmers of Maui by scientific experiments in matters pertaining to agriculture on the island.

This will mean a great deal to the people here and the plan has Mr. Baldwin's heartiest approval and he will assist in the establishment of the station.

As Territorial aid will be necessary to the establishment of such an institution it will be necessary to elect a straight Republican legislative ticket who will lend every assistance in getting the necessary appropriation to establish and maintain the same. We give herewith the latter in full.

Dear Sir:

I intend asking the legislature for an appropriation for the purpose of establishing a substation on Maui in the Kula district, to see whether we cannot do something to improve agricultural conditions and methods there. My plan would be to put a good man in Kula, provided an equipment of modern farm machinery and try to improve the corn crop and introduce other crops which might prove more profitable.

I would like to have your support, politically, towards this end. From what I have seen of the Portuguese farmers I think they need a good deal of help from people who know how. Their wine industry might be saved with a little assistance, so also other industries where they are losing their grip through lack of knowledge.
