sisting of Patrick Cockett, A. Enos, and W. A. Conway, who visited the locality. On the strength of their report, the Grand Jury recommends that the county Attorney be instructed to inquire immediately into the legal rights of the matter, as to whether this is a public highway, or merely a road used by the public through the courtesy of the Pioneer Mill Co.

Matters other than those touched upon in your charge were brought to the attention of the Grand Jury, to wit. The case against John W. Recard, District Magistrate of Lahaina, charged with receiving bribes, was gone into fully, and he was exonerated by this body.

We respectfully thank this Honorable Court and its officers for the courtesies extended to us during the performance of our duties.

We further extend our thanks to Daniel H. Case, Esq., Deputy Attorney General for the thorough manner in which he has presented all matters before this body.

The real work of the Circuit Court began Monday morning when the first case on the criminal calendar was tried. It was entitled Territory of Hawaii v. Kazi Fukizo. Assault and Battery with a weapon etc. J. M. Vivas defended. The case took the whole day and the jury were out until ten o'clock that night but failed to agree. The case was one of especial interest as it involved the question of how far a man had a right to take the law into his own hands to protect the peace and purity of his home.

The second case was of L. K. Akana charged with perjury. He was defended by J. M. Vivas and J. Lightfoot. The case was of considerable interest as the defendant is the same person who incurred the enmity of a number of prominent Chinese on account of his having arrested many of his race for che fa and other gambling games.

Whether this enmity had any thing to do with this case is of course unknown but there are a number of people who doubt the disinterestedness of some at least. The jury brought in a verdict of not guilty. Nawai was adjudged guilty and given a sentence of five years for burglary.

The Court had considerable trouble in finding an attorney for Antonio Seyer and Ramon de Concepcion charged with Assault with a weapon and mayhem respectively but finally prevailed on J. N. K. Keola and Hugh M. Coke to take the cases. The date of trial was set for Friday.
