

HONOLULU, October 15.—The Grand Jury is investigating the Standard Oil case.

A committee of Supervisors after testing declare eight miles too slow for automobile riding. They will recommend a higher speed allowance.

The Board of Education says it is twenty teachers short of the number needed for the present school attendance.

Jas. E. Higgins of the Experiment Station, says he has arranged for special rates for shipping fruit on trains of the Continental lines going out of San Francisco. The rate is the same as that given to California fruit growers.

SAN FRANCISCO, October 15.—Rioting against the Japanese broke out again yesterday. A mob of drunken laborers joined by a large number of hoodlums attacked a Japanese laundry and wrecked it. The police responded to the riot call and beat off the rioters with clubs. Two Japanese were severely injured in the fighting.

TANGIERS, October 15.—The rebels raided the Custom House at Maxagin and seized 1000 rifles.

BERLIN, October 15.—The report is generally believed throughout Europe that Germany will absorb the German provinces in Austria at the Emperor's death. It is officially denied. The crisis in the illness of Emperor Franz Joseph has passed and the immediate danger of death is not apparent.

STOCKHOLM, October 15.—Funds have been guaranteed for the payment of the amount needed for a challenger for the America Cup.

SAN FRANCISCO, October 15.—The Grand Jury is investigating the alleged plot to kidnap Abe Ruef and get him away from testifying in the graft cases.

It is probable that Admiral Dewey will be in San Francisco on the arrival of the fleet.

NEW YORK, October 15.—An organization has been formed among the Postal Telegraph men to arbitrate on all matters or complaints between Employees and Telegraph Companies.

HONOLULU, October 4.—The rubber convention on Maui proved a great success. Governor Frear predicts that rubber will be a strong rival to the sugar industry.

Wallach's mass meeting at Aiea Saturday night was largely attended. He says he will talk no more. It is up to the leaders of the Hawaiian people. He will do whatever Notley says.

HONOLULU, October 14.—Joseph Smith, the anti-polygamy fighter, is here to dedicate new church of the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ, of the Latter Day Saints.

A reception to the public will be given today on the French cruiser Catinet.

A letter from Washington says that President Roosevelt favors the criminal dock for oil men.

MANILA, October 14.—Great interest is taken in Secretary Taft's visit. It is believed his opinions will influence the assembly.

TOKIO, October 14.—Count Okuma believes the Japanese question will solve itself by the discouragement of Japanese immigration and by strict enforcement of the law.

NEW YORK, October 14.—Marconi has made the statement that Trans-Atlantic wireless will be inaugurated on Tuesday next.

SAN FRANCISCO, October 14.—The steamer Mariposa, which ran out of fuel oil, was towed here. Mate Watson rowed a boat 78 miles from the steamer to Monterey to secure a tug.

NEW YORK, October 13.—President Small of the Telegrapher's union told the striking telegraphers to return to work but they declined.

NEW YORK, October 14.—The Executive Committee of the Telegrapher's Union has suspended President Small for attempted interference in the strike.

VIENNA, October 13.—Emperor Franz Joseph is weaker.

WASHINGTON, October 13.—The cruisers Washington and Tennessee were ordered to sail for the Pacific.

CHICAGO, October 13.—The gate receipts at the ball games last week were over \$100,000.

OAKLAND, October 13.—In the game between the San Francisco and Oakland's Barney Joy went to the bad and lost the game.

DETROIT, October 13.—The Chicago Nationals have been declared champions, having beaten the Detroit's again.

LONDON, October 13.—The Liberals have begun an oratorical campaign against the present unrestricted power of veto of the House of Lords.

HONOLULU, October 12.—The merchants agree that insurance rates are fair.

The Jiyu Shinbun received a dispatch from Tokio to the effect that the Canadian authorities may keep out of Canada all Japanese from Hawaii without the action being considered a breach of the existing treaty between the two governments.

Wallach offers to furnish the Attorney-General with sufficient evidence to warrant his arrest for practicing medicine without a license. Wallach's playing for Hawaiian sympathy has been denounced by Delegate Kubio.

The court rooms occupied by Judges Lindsay and Robinson have been declared unsafe.

The steamer Alameda and the French man-of-war Catinet arrived this morning.

The T. K. K. S. S. Nippon Maru from the Orient left for the Coast last night.

VIENNA, October 12.—The condition of the Emperor is critical.

LOS ANGELES, October 12.—The Santa Fe Railroad has been found guilty of rebating. The maximum fine may be \$1,000,000.

HAYTI, October 12.—Sixteen revolutionists were condemned to death for attempting to overthrow the government.

DETROIT, October 12.—The Chicago Nationals won again in the baseball contest.

NAHIKU, October 12.—Sixty-three rubber enthusiasts from Maui and Honolulu arrived at the rubber plantation at 5.40 a. m. After breakfast at the Hawaiian-American quarters they began sightseeing through the various plantations. Two trees were tapped by Mr. Bradford of the U. S. Experiment Station, Honolulu.


