HONOLULU, October 22.—President Pinkham of the Board of Health will recommend that Wallach be allowed to go to Molokai.

Wm. Notley, the Home Rule leader, writes to have Wallach treated lepers at the Kalihi Receiving Station for obvious reasons and to insist upon it.

The crew of the whaling schooner Carrie and Annie passed through on the steamer Asia. They complain of the treatment accorded them by the American consul at Vladivostok.

TANGIERS, October 22.—General Drude has resumed hostilities on account of parties of French troops having been ambushed by the Moors.

PARIS, October 22.—The Sultan is said to be in desperate financial straits. It is feared that a holy war may be declared. It is reported that Malay Hasid has gained a decisive victory over the Sultan's troops.

NEW YORK, October 22.—The weaker banks are being aided.

SANTA BARBARA, October 22.—The cruiser fleet is maneuvering here today.

NEW YORK, October 21.—The clearing houses will come to the rescue of the Mercantile National Bank. Some interests have been eliminated and it is believed this will prevent a crisis. Seth Miliken has been appointed President.

ST. LOUIS, October 21.—Nine balloons have entered in the competition for the Bennett Cup race today. The Governments represented are America, England, Germany and France.

WASHINGTON, October 21.—Because the plans of shipbuilders contemplate larger boats the Panama Canal will be considerably wider at greater expense of money and time.

MANILA, October 20.—In the Legislative Assembly the Filipinos passed a resolution of thanks to the United States government for establishing local government.

LONDON, October 20.—A new Hamburg liner is planned to be larger than the Lusitania.

NEW YORK, October 21.—Wheat jumped four cents a bushel on account of the failure of crops in Australia and India.

WASHINGTON, October 20.—Comptroller Ridgley has declined the Presidency of the Mercantile National Bank.

TOKIO, October 20.—The Japanese government will take charge of and treat all Japanese lepers now in the Islands or who may hereafter contract disease there.

DECATUR, Ill., October 20.—The Magille, husband and wife, who were charged with the murder of the male prisoner's first wife, have been acquitted.

HONOLULU, October 21.—Secretary H. P. Wood of the Hawaii Promotion Committee, is so pleased with the Kona prospects that he is writing to physicians relative to establishing a sanitarium there with a capital of \$100,000.

HONOLULU, October 20.—Wallach's mass meeting last night was attended by an immense crowd. Resolutions calling on the Governor to allow him to treat lepers at Molokai were passed by a rising vote. There was no disorder whatever.

The revenue cutter Manning will return here after being repaired at the Bremerton navy yards.

ST. PETERSBURG, October 21.—M. Walling of Indianapolis, whose wife is a sister of Rose Strunsky collaborator with Jack London, has been arrested for complicity in a Finnish plot against the Russian government.

LONDON, October 21.—The Republican National Committee will meet on December 1st to arrange the holding of the National convention next year.

STAMBOUL, La., October 21.—President Roosevelt killed 3 bears, 1 wild turkey, 12 squirrels, 1 pussum and 1 wild cat. Everything was eaten but the wild cat.

HONOLULU, October 19.—At a meeting of the Improvement Club opposition was made to the selling of the Fishmarket site.

Kaapana, killed his wife Friday night by kicking her to death while drunk. The woman was found unconscious in a lane and the man is now under arrest.

Automobiles are now allowed to go at a 15 mile gait. At a big mass meeting to be held tonight at Aala Park, Wallach will call upon the leaders of the Hawaiian people to assist him. Governor Frear has finally decided to complete the Nuanu Dam. Strychnine was found in the free lunch soup prepared at the Pantheon Saloon. No one was hurt by it.

It is stated that the Merchant's Association turned down the American-Hawaiian S. S. Co's partnership proposition fearing to put themselves in the hands of a monopoly.

NEW YORK, October 19.—The demoralization of Wall Street continues. Many firms are hard pressed by the panic brought on through the manipulations of Amalgamated Copper.

Comptroller Ridgley has accepted the presidency of the Mercantile National Bank.

ST. LOUIS, October 19.—A balloon entered by the United States army to compete for the Bennett Cup won by traveling a distance of 500 miles. The United States won in Paris last year by an army representative.

THE HAGUE, October 19. The American and British delegates yesterday signed an agreement for permanent arbitration between the two countries. Congratulations were cabled to President Roosevelt and the conference adjourned.

NEW YORK, October 19.—Small has resigned the Presidency of the Telegrapher's Union owing to recent differences.

MANILA, October 19.—It is rumored that an attempt was made to kill Secretary Taft with a bomb.

VANCOUVER, October 19.—The British steamer Tartar collided with the Charmer in the straits and was later beached.


