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ning presiding. The report of the County Attorney was again taken up. Mr. Pogue moved that the report be received and placed on file. Seconded by Mr. Meyer and carried.

The report of the County Engineer was read.

Mr. Pogue presented Resolution No. 1120 thereby closing the old road from the foot of Kamole Hill and opening the newly relocated road, and the adoption of the same. Seconded by Mr. Haia and carried.

Mr. Pogue presented Resolution No. 1121 thereby closing the old and opening the new road from Kean to Maliko, the same to take effect from the 1st of January 1909, and moved the adoption of the same. Seconded by Mr. Kaiue and carried.

Mr. Meyer presented Resolution No. 1122 thereby closing the old and opening the new road at Ukunehame and moved the adoption of the same. Seconded by Mr. Haia and carried.

Mr. Meyer presented Resolution No. 1123 thereby closing the old and opening the new road from Napili to Honokahua and moved the adoption of the same. Seconded by Mr. Pogue and carried.

Mr. Meyer presented Resolution No. 1124 thereby closing the old road and opening the new road at Kinnapali, and moved the adoption of the same. Seconded by Mr. Pogue and carried.

Mr. Pogue moved that the County Engineer be instructed positively to secure titles to the various new roads which have been opened up, 4 in Makawao District and 2 in Lahaina District; to have the same completed so as to be reported upon at the next meeting of the Board. Seconded by Meyer and carried.

Mr. Pogue moved that this Board approve of the various small contracts which have been let by the County Engineer for the connecting link of the Kuan-Maliko road.

Mr. Pogue moved that the County Engineer be instructed to make a preliminary survey of the Paia-Makawao road as recommended by him. Seconded by Haia and carried.

Mr. Pogue moved that the report be accepted and placed on file. Seconded by Mr. Meyer and carried.

The County Engineer presented specifications of the 2nd section of the relocation from Waikina culvert east towards Peahi. The same was read.

Mr. Pogue moved that the County Engineer be authorized and instructed to advertise for bids for the construction of this section, the bids to be opened on Thursday, December 10, at 1:30 P. M. Seconded by Mr. Meyer and carried.

Mr. Meyer moved that the clerk be instructed to communicate with the Board of Health with a view to securing a Doctor for the District of Molokai. Seconded by Mr. Pogue and carried.

Communication of R. H. Hitchcock applying for the position of Sanitary Inspector for the District of Molokai was read and the same was ordered placed on file. Mr. Meyer moved that Mr. Hitchcock be appointed Sanitary Inspector for the District of Molokai. Seconded by Mr. Pogue and carried.

The Chairman announced that he had appointed John Hose Fish as Food Inspector for the District of Lahaina. Mr. Haia moved that John Hose's appointment be approved. Seconded by Mr. Meyer and carried.

Mr. Kaiue stated that he had appointed Manuel Dutro temporary Fish and Food Inspector for the District of Wailuku.

Mr. Pogue moved that the consideration of the appointment of Fish and Food Inspector for the District of Wailuku be postponed until tomorrow at 10 o'clock A. M. Seconded by Mr. Haia and carried.

Mr. Pogue's report on matters referred to him was taken up, and the same was ordered placed on file.

Communication of Dr. Dinggar was taken up for consideration. Mr. Pogue moved that Dr. Dinggar be granted the permission necessary for the construction of his pipe

across Main street with the under-

standing however that he must first notify the road authorities when he is ready to tear up the streets. Seconded by Mr. Kaiue and carried. Communication filed.

Communication of Raymond C. Brown, Inspector in charge of Immigration was taken for consideration.

Mr. Pogue moved that the Clerk make appropriate reply. Seconded by Mr. Kaiue and carried. Communication filed.

Communication of the Wireless Telegraph Company was taken up for consideration. Mr. Pogue moved that the contract with the Wireless Telegraph Company be approved. Seconded by Mr. Meyer and carried.

Communication of Jas. L. Coke in re Pruvia Goodness claim was ordered placed on file.

Mr. Pogue moved that the County do not approve of the claim of Pruvia Goodness. Seconded by Mr. Haia and carried. Kaiue voting NO.

At 4 P. M. the bids for the completion of the Wailuku Town Hall were opened. The results are as follows:—

Chas. O'Sullivan for constructing \$925 work to be done in 45 days and a certified check for \$50 was enclosed.

Chas. O'Sullivan for painting \$350 work to be done in 30 days cash amounting to \$15 enclosed.

A. B. Naone for painting \$382.50 work to be done in 30 days cash amounting to \$15 enclosed.

J. A. Harris for painting \$300.00 work to be done in 30 days certified check for \$15 enclosed.

Mr. Pogue moved that Chas. O'Sullivan's bid of \$925 for the completion of the construction of the Wailuku Town Hall be accepted. Seconded by Mr. Haia and carried.

Mr. Pogue moved that the bid of J. A. Harris for painting the Wailuku Town Hall accepted. Seconded by Mr. Haia and carried.

Recess taken at 4:30 P. M.  
EVENING SESSION.

The Board was called to order at 7:30 P. M. Chairman W. Henning presiding. A number of Wailuku citizens were present by invitation. The Chairman explained the purpose of the meeting viz.: to consider ways of government of the Wailuku Town Hall.

Considerable discussion followed. Mr. Pogue moved to adjourn to 9:30 A. M. tomorrow. Seconded by Haia and carried.

Adjourned at 9:30 P. M.  
MORNING SESSION.

Wailuku, Nov. 13, 1908.  
The Board was called to order at 9:30 A. M. Chairman W. Henning presiding. Present W. Henning, W. P. Haia, S. E. Kaiue, T. T. Meyer and W. F. Pogue. Minutes of yesterday's meeting were read and the same were ordered approved.

Mr. Haia presented Resolution No. 1125 thereby approving Material and Supply demands and moved the adoption of the same. Seconded by Mr. Meyer and carried.

Mr. Meyer presented Resolution No. 1126 thereby appropriating the sum of \$17.20 to the fund known as Especials All Districts and moved the adoption of the same. Seconded by Mr. Kaiue and carried.

Mr. Haia presented Resolution No. 1127 thereby appropriating the sum of \$60.18 to the fund known as Election Expenses and moved to adopt the same. Seconded by Mr. Kaiue and carried.

Mr. Kaiue presented Resolution No. 1128 thereby appropriating the sum of 71.18 to the fund known as Incidentals County Engineer and moved to adopt the same. Seconded by Mr. Meyer and carried.

The matter of the appointment of a Hack and Fish and Food Inspector for the District of Wailuku was taken up for consideration.

Mr. Pogue moved that W. E. K. Maikai be appointed Hack and Fish and Food Inspector for the District of Wailuku.

Mr. Kaiue moved that Manuel Dutro be appointed Hack and Fish and Food Inspector for the District of Wailuku.

Mr. Haia seconded Mr. Pogue's motion. Mr. Kaiue withdraws his motion. Mr. Pogue's motion was put and carried.

Mr. Pogue moved that memorandum of Dr. Dinggar's in re amendment to automobile ordinance be referred to the County Attorney with the request that he draw up an ordinance to cover the points therein enumerated. Seconded by Mr. Meyer and carried.

Mr. Haia moved that the Clerk be instructed to advertise in the Maui News of these proposed changes, also to state in such advertisement the substance of those changes. Seconded by Mr. Pogue and carried.

Mr. Pogue moved that the County Attorney be requested to draw up a set of rules for the management of the Wailuku Town Hall and report upon the same at the next meeting of the Board, and that the Clerk of this Board notify the President of the Wailuku Improvement Association of this action. Seconded by Mr. Kaiue and carried.

The matter of the pay of County employees was taken up for discussion. Mr. Pogue moved that all road overseers be requested to send in an estimate for all the labor required from the 1st to the 15th of December and further that the road overseers be requested to find out the sentiment as to whether or not the laborers wish to be paid twice a month, or only once a month as at present. Seconded by Mr. Haia and carried.

Mr. Pogue moved to adjourn. Seconded by Haia and carried.
