HONOLULU, October 12.—C. Bolte is under arrest for criminal intimacy with Mrs. Jacob Coerper. Flashlight pictures figure as evidence.

Count Otani peer and priest, was warmly welcomed here. A million and a half will be appropriated for the purpose of dredging Pearl Harbor. Colonel Dening is coming to arrange details. \$25,000 was pledged last night at a dinner toward a new Y. M. C. building.

Ambassador O'Brien passed through on the Mongolia yesterday.

HAVANA, October 12.—A hurricane struck this city yesterday with great force. There was no loss of life but the property loss was great.

KEY WEST, October 12.—A hurricane sweeping up from the Gulf yesterday spread ruin through the town. The damage in this city is estimated at \$2,000,000.

FAIRBANKS, Alaska, October 12.—Navigation on the Tanana is closed. A number of steamers are reported caught in the ice.

DETROIT, October 12.—Twenty five thousand persons watched the Pittsburg team beat the Detroit's yesterday. The score was 6 to 8.

LOS ANGELES, October 12.—President Taft was the guest of the business men last night after making a close inspection of San Pedro.

COLLEGE PARK, October 12.—Wilbur Wright aeroplaned the circular one kilometer track in 17 minutes and one fifth of a second.

WASHINGTON, October 12.—Unusual precautions are being taken by Japan to prevent fraud in pass ports of immigrants headed for America.

NEW YORK, October 11.—Financier Morse must serve a sentence of 15 years in prison.

HONOLULU, October 11.—The steamer Claudine will continue to carry mail to Hawaii ports. The contract does not expire until July.

J. D. Gains, the cable manager, has arrived. It is rumored that he will be assigned to Midway for six months.

The Buddhist prince is due to arrive today. The prospects for raising \$100,000 for a new Y. M. C. A. building are favorable.

The Mongolia is expected this morning.

WASHINGTON, October 11.—It is probable that Crane will not get a China post owing it is said to his remarks relative to the Japanese-China war. His utterances were of such a character as to forbid his representing a neutral friendly power. Crane was in San Francisco and was ready to sail when he was ordered to return to Washington and report to Knox. After an interview with Taft he went to Washington.

NEW YORK, October 11.—Gaynor charges Hearst with betraying him. He says Hearst induced him to accept the nomination and promised him the support of his papers. Hearst then accepted the nomination on the Independent ticket.

TOKIO, October 11.—No credence is given the report that the United States will enter a protest against the agreement between China and Japan relative to the Mukden Railway.

FRESNO, October 11.—Taft delivered an address here in the presence of the largest gathering ever assembled in this city.

DETROIT, October 11.—The third game of the championship series has been postponed on account of rain.

HONOLULU, October 9.—The Federal authorities are beginning to raid opium sellers. Yuen Chong's store was searched yesterday.

Work on the telephone construction will be pushed.

The Governor is considering calling an extra session. Nothing definite has been decided.

Scott of Kona lost the case against Pedro in the Supreme Court.

NEW YORK, October 9.—British warships passing Governor's Island on the way to their home stations boomed salutes, but when the French warships passed there their guns were silent. This might cause comment.

NEW YORK, October 9.—Associate Justice Moody is in a critical state of health at his home in Haverhill.

GLACIER POINT, October 9.—Guarded by troops of cavalry President Taft reposed peacefully in a hotel here last night.

COLLEGE PARK, Md., October 9.—The government aeroplane had its first flight yesterday. Wilbur Wright was at the tiller and everything was satisfactory. The flight was successful.

NEW YORK, October 9.—Hearst will also run at the coming election for Mayor.

SAN BERNARDINO, October 9.—Although surrounded by a sheriff's posse Willie Boy, a renegade Indian wanted for murder, eluded his pursuers and escaped to the mountains after killing a deputy.

TOPEKA, Kansas, October 9.—Fifteen persons were killed in a railway accident which occurred here today.

NEW YORK, October 9.—Two million dollars in gold will shortly be shipped to Japan.

PITTSBURG, October 8.—Papke won from Willie Lewis in a six-round contest tonight. The receipts amounted to over \$40,000.

WASHINGTON, October 8.—The revenue cutter Thetis will probably leave for Honolulu to be stationed there after her return from the North.
