HONOLULU, October 26.—Honolulu is to have a field artillery. Two batteries are to come from Fort Riley, Kansas. Irwin & Co. have sold all their plantation interests. The lands at Kaole, Puna, Hawaii are to be opened to homesteaders. The Korea is making a quick run for lost time.

TOKIO, October 26.—Prince Ito was assassinated by a Korean patriot at Harbin yesterday. The murderer escaped.

MADRID, October 26.—Weyler is to be given command of all forces in the field against the Moors.

COLLEGE PARK, October 26.—Wilbur Wright stopped his motor while in mid air and sailed without power. He experienced no difficulty.

MILWAUKEE, October 26.—A boiler in the Pabst brewery exploded and killed one man.

ST. LOUIS, October 26.—Speaker Cannon was well treated in St. Louis. The people received him with enthusiasm.

HONOLULU, October 25.—Chief Leal and the Porto Rican interpreter are said to be implicated in the graft business. Gambling is running almost openly.

Another assault by a Japanese on a countryman has been reported and Jockey Ferreira collared a man who had assaulted a Japanese woman on the street.

The steamer Korea, first of the Pacific Mail boats to be equipped with wireless, reported her position last night at 884 miles from Honolulu.

The Japanese warship Idzumo is to come here and remain a week. Cooper dropped the charge against Bolte and the case is withdrawn. No proceedings in divorce are noted.

HONOLULU, October 24.—Mrs. Manaku, sister of Representative J. W. Moanauli of Hawaii, dropped dead in her yard yesterday. It is reported that there will be a police investigation by the Grand Jury on account of rumors of grafting.

BRUSSELS, October 25.—An officer of the Congo Rubber Co. brings news of further outrages in the Congo Free State. Many natives are being killed and villages burned.

RACCAGNI, October 25.—The Czar and King Emmanuel of Italy met today at a great banquet.

LITTLE ROCK, October 25.—President Taft ended his visit yesterday and started for St. Louis from here. He will go down the Mississippi and inspect the great river.

NEW YORK, October 25.—Admiral Erben is dead.

CZENSTOCHAWA, Poland, October 25.—Jewels and the robe of the statue of the Blessed Virgin, valued at several million roubles, have been stolen.

ST. PETERSBURG, October 24.—A plan to sell the Manchurian railway interests is being considered by the Russian government.

SAN FRANCISCO, October 24.—At the close of the Portola Festival there was a street carnival and dancers filled the streets.

ROCKLAND, Maine, October 24.—The U. S. S. Delaware made 21.98 knots on her speed trial.

NEW YORK, October 24.—The anti-Tammany forces are accusing Tammany of protecting vice and the white slave traffic.

HONOLULU, October 23.—Teachers are sore over the examinations demanded and roast the Department in consequence.

Eighty thousand Manila cigars were sent back on account of irregularities in the shipment. Manila cigars must come direct in order to be admitted free.

Russian laborers will leave for Hawaii and other islands today.

CALCUTTA, October 23.—Beluchistan was severely rocked by an earthquake yesterday.

BLACK POOL, October 23.—Latham made a sensational flight yesterday during a severe storm. He guided the aeroplane during the storm and made 100 miles an hour.

CORPUS CHRISTI, October 23.—In a speech yesterday President Taft approved the issuance of bonds to improve the system of inland waterways.
