



The Cholera Situation.

NEW YORK, July 19.—An examination of Cholera patients shows five Cholera carriers. These had been held as contacts.
HAVANA, July 19.—It has been decided that it is impracticable to raise the Maine. Evidence procured shows the explosion to have occurred on the inside. The hull lies buried in 40 feet of mud.
LOS ANGELES, July 19.—The testimony of McMonigle in the McNamara case is very strong. His wife will not be obliged to testify.
PARIS, July 19.—France has demanded an explanation from Spain for the arrest of a French Consular agent in Morocco.
CITY OF MEXICO, July 19.—Bakers are on strike, and a bread famine is eminent.

Deaths From Cholera.

NEW YORK, July 18.—Six deaths have occurred from cholera. On account of the extreme heat, and consequent demand for ice, the Nickerbocker Ice Co. has doubled its prices for ice.
BUDAPEST, July 18.—This city experienced a severe earthquake yesterday. Many buildings were damaged.
WASHINGTON, July 18.—The new Japanese treaty of commerce and navigation became effective yesterday.
The government has commenced suit to force a separation of the Redding Railroad from the Redding Coal and Iron Co.

Cholera in New York.

NEW YORK, July 17.—There has been an outbreak of Cholera in this city. Swineburn island has been made a quarantine Station. There are 15 patients.
CITY OF MEXICO, July 17.—The agitation for the exclusion of Chinese from Mexico is spreading. It is expected the next Mexican Congress will pass an exclusion act.
The German minister is investigating the killing of four Germans during the recent trouble.
WASHINGTON, July 17.—Chicago, New York, Boston and St. Louis have been designated as cities for postal savings banks.
LONDON, July 17.—Jack Johnson and Bonbordier Wells have been matched to fight before the National Sporting Club on September 30th.
COLUMBUS, Ohio, July 17.—Fire destroyed the pleasure park in this city yesterday.
BAY CITY, Michigan, July 17.—Heavy rains in northeastern Michigan has done much damage. Refugees tell of destruction of homes.

England Signs Pact.

LONDON, July 15.—The signing in England of the Japanese pact yesterday eliminates all possibility of England and the United States becoming enemies. Japanese Supremacy in Korea is acknowledged. England is not bound to support Japan if that country gets in trouble with any nation with which England has treaty.
ERIE, Pa., July 15.—Bud Mars fell from his aeroplane yesterday and was slightly injured.
WASHINGTON, July 15.—Baker of California dealt Hawaii a body blow in Congress yesterday when he said that practically all the plantation laborers are foreigners.
WASHINGTON, July 15.—Aviator Atwood completed a wonderful voyage from Boston yesterday. He circled the Washington monument and alighted on the White House lawn. He was presented with a medal by President Taft.
OAKLAND, July 12.—Henry Dalton former tax assessor for the County of Alameda, has been found guilty of accepting a bribe from the Spring Valley Water Co.

Honolulu News.

HONOLULU, July 19.—Honokaa sold yesterday for \$11.25, Ewa for \$31.75, and H. C. & S. Co. for \$38.37.
The Supervisors passed the road bill over the mayor's veto by a vote of 6 to 1.
Mrs. McQuaid asks the Supreme Court to set aside the verdict of divorce given her former husband.
Mrs. Redhouse writes from Nebraska, trying to prevent her husband from getting a divorce. She says, he deserted her leaving her penniless and taking all her jewelry.
Judge Clemmons has presented a hypothetical case to the grand jury in the matter of expunging the Richmond case from the records. He evidently agrees with the jury report, but says it is not according to law.
HONOLULU, July 18.—Judge Clemmons has sent back the report of the last federal grand jury for amendments. It is believed that the report handed to Richmond, as well as the praise of Mrs. Compton, will be expunged.
Marston Campbell, who leaves for Hilo today, brands the Hilo reports relative to federal engineers, as falsehoods. He favors the appointment of federal engineers because Southwick will have his hands full with County work.
