



Sugar Still Soaring.

NEW YORK, Sept. 6.—Quotations on raw sugar jumped 20 points yesterday. Refined was boosted 15 points in sympathy. Centrifugals sold at 5.56.

LIMA, Peru, Sept. 6.—The coasting steamer Lucapele struck a submerged rock of this coast. The crew and 81 passengers were drowned.

PEKIN, Sept. 6.—A revolution has broken out in Southern China, and Canton is in the hands of the mob.

KEIL, Sept. 6.—The Kaiser reviewed the fleet assembled for manoeuvres. This is the strongest fleet ever assembled under the German flag.

FORT WORTH, Sept. 6.—Bailey has announced that he is not a candidate for the Senate.

NEW YORK, Sept. 6.—Sam Langford defeated Joe Jeannette in ten rounds here last night.

Gotch Holds Title.

CHICAGO, Sept. 5.—Frank Gotch, the world's champion wrestler, defeated Hackenschmidt in two straight falls before a large crowd. The first fall was won in 14 minutes 18 1-5 seconds. The second fall in 5 minutes 55 1-2 seconds. Gotch received \$21,000. Farmer Burns trained Gotch.

HANKOW, China, Sept. 5.—The worst flood in years is sweeping the country bordering on the Yang Tse Kiang river. It has destroyed 95 per cent of the crops. It is estimated that 100,000 persons have been drowned.

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 5.—Johnny Kilbane defeated Joe Rivers here last night in the sixteenth round.

CHICAGO, Sept. 5.—The Illinois Central announced yesterday their refusal to deal with the officers of the Shopmen's union. The men will strike, and thousands of workmen will be affected.

JUNO, Alaska, Sept. 5.—Eleven persons were burned to death in the destruction of the Juno hotel.

Mexico in Turmoil.

CITY OF MEXICO, Sept. 4.—Political riots broke out yesterday when Gen. Reyes tried to speak. Accompanied by several friends, Reyes took a position on the balcony opposite the municipal theatre. When he attempted to speak he was stoned. Troops were called out to restore order.

BERLIN, Sept. 4.—David Payne Hill, the retiring American ambassador declined a decoration from the Emperor.

NELSON, B. C. Sept. 4.—The Hill mines smelter covering an area of 13 acres has been burned. The loss is three quarters of a million dollars.

ST. PETERSBURG, Sept. 4.—The Czar and all his court were present at the marriage of the son of the Grand Duke Alexis, and Princess Helena.

BUTTE, Sept. 4.—Six miners were going up in a cage at the Black Rock mine, when some long drills which were being removed, caught in the side timbers. The men were cut to pieces and beheaded.

Bandits Getting Bold.

REDDING, Cal., Sept. 2.—The Southern Oregon Express on the S. P. R. R. was held up by bandits north of here last night. The robbers escaped.

CHICAGO, Sept. 2.—The Shopmen's Union have served notice on the Illinois Central that they desire a change in the contracts. The officials have asked for further conference.

NORTON, Kansas, Sept. 2.—Aviator Frisbie declined to go up during a storm, and he was jeered at by the crowd until he became desperate, and made the attempt. He was dashed to the earth and killed.

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 2.—Walter Owen Brown, a well known Illinois physician has murdered his wife and committed suicide.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 2.—Representative Carter has thrashed four department clerks who had been annoying his daughter.


