

Fighting Machine

Scott. This device is arranged with mechanical sighting appliances which enable the gunner to hurl a missile with deadly accuracy upon an object below. It is proposed to use this projector in order to fire picrate of potash bombs and shells filled with cynogen, a gas so deadly that its fumes cause death for more than a mile around the spot where it is liberated in any quantity.

The aviator or pilot of the craft will ride in front with all his steering gear and motor throttles and levers before him. The actual scout, who makes the map, defends the aeroplane and sends the wireless messages, will sit behind the aviator, slightly to one side, so as to give him an unimpeded view of the surroundings. Before him he will have a compass, a barograph, a tiny drawing table with the cardboard securely fixed, a pad sunk in the table, and to another side he will have his wireless outfit. The aeriels will run from the top of the craft.

Under the seats occupied by the pilot and the scout will be built compartments capable of holding 500 rounds of ammunition.

An ingenious scheme is being worked out to heat the cab while flying through cold air strata. The searchlight in front of the aeroplane will be provided with power generated through a magneto. The same magneto will supply the power for the wireless apparatus. In order that the scout may not be disturbed in sending or receiving messages the motor will be muffled. It is proposed to provide every comfort for the fighting air soldier, the absence of which might interfere with his efficiency. New ideas suggested by military folk will be incorporated in the craft.

For this reason Mr. Sloane is co-operating with military authorities. He is seeking the best advice that he can obtain. He is trying to make his craft as serviceable as it can be made for present military purposes. There will be no radical departure in the construction of the of the aeroplane itself. The lines and principles are wholly identical with those already well known. The only difference lies in the cab.

The total weight of the craft without passengers will be 1,500 pounds.

When the machine has been completed it will probably be tested at the Bergen Beach field of the Aeronautical Society. This is expected to be in March or April. If the craft is found to come up to its builder's expectations it will be presented to the Government. In this way it is probable that the United States may become the possessor of the first genuine, armored aerial fighting machine.
