WEEKLY MARKET LETTER.

Cabbage and Eggs Coming More Freely

HONOLULU, December 13.—There has been a slight increase in the number of eggs coming into the market but not enough have been received to make any difference in last week's prices.

There will be a good market for all kinds of fat poultry during the Christmas holidays. Poor stock is especially undesirable now.

The price of cabbage has fallen a little. It is now coming into the market in larger quantities from all the islands and it is likely that the price will again drop in the near future. There is good demand for tomatoes and sweet corn.

Hogs are plentiful and cheap and there is no change in the dressed meat market. Hides are bringing top notch prices.

The Marketing Division expects to move into its new building on Mauna Kea street where there will be plenty of room for the better handling of consignments on the twentieth of this month.
