Lecturer On Hawaii Objects To War Draft

HONOLULU, Aug. 22.—Word of the pending arrest for alleged conspiracy against the draft act of the Rev. Robert Whitaker who visited here the first of the year and collected material for a lecture on Hawaii has been received from J. Walter Scott, coast representative of the Hawaii Promotion committee by A. P. Taylor, secretary of the committee.

Mr. Whitaker is pastor of the Los Gatos, Cal. Baptist church, editor of the Los Gatos Idea, and well-known as a lecturer and traveler. According to Mr. Scott, his lectures on the "Isles of Peace" were extended to cover objections to the selective draft act and now the government has taken a hand and Mr. Whitaker faces a \$10,000 fine or 20 years in jail.

Urges Demonstration Farms

William G. Moir, county agent for East Hawaii under the territorial food commission, is urging that that body institute a number of demonstration farms in different sections. He says it is up to the commission to show the farmers what can be done, rather than to preach to them what they should do.

Guardsmen May Go To Honolulu

National guard officers are planning for a general encampment of the two regiments in the territory, to be held in Honolulu about the middle of October. If the plan matures, it will mean that all of the troops of the islands will be taken to Honolulu for a 10-day period of training. There will be about 4000 men in all.

Honolulu Papers Makes Freak Story Of Accident

That Fate had something up her sleeve at the time is evident from the fact that just before the locomotive reached a certain point in the road a tree on the bank toppled over.


This would not have been so bad had not Fate arranged to place a telephone wire in the way of the falling tree. The telephone wire was the final warp in the web.


