

Boy Scouts At Fair Invaluable--Crowell

Sheriff Praises Work Of Local Troops -- Fair Handled Without A Single Arrest And With No One Seriously Hurt

Sheriff Clem Crowell feels much gratified that the entire fair week passed with no arrests being necessary and with no accidents of any consequence occurring in connection with the fair.

Owing to the narrowness of the road paving from Kahului to the fair ground gates, and the lack of side walks, the congestion of automobiles and pedestrians was extremely heavy for three days. It was very well handled, however, by policemen every hundred yards along the way.

Sheriff Crowell also expresses highest appreciation of the work done by the Boy Scouts, who were on duty at all times at the fair, guarding exhibits running errands, and directing visitors. It would have been difficult to have handled the crowds without these boys, the Sheriff states.

Altogether 84 boy scouts worked throughout the fair week and there was not a single complaint made against them from any source. Troops from Wailuku, Lahaina and Puunene were represented.

Man In Fit Causes Auto Tragedy Rumor

Report Widely Current That Man Had Been Killed By Speeding Car Which Then Had Disappeared--Did Have Narrow Escape

Because no one happened to be looking at the instant that Arakaki, of Waikapu, fell in a faint upon the road near the fair grounds, last Saturday evening, it was immediately concluded by those who saw him on the ground a few seconds later that he had been struck by a passing automobile and had been killed.

In this way the rumor rapidly spread that a man had been killed by a motor vehicle, and that the driver of the machine had put on all speed and disappeared before anyone could catch his number.

At the Malulani hospital the supposed dead or dying man was put to bed with an ice-pack at his head, when he suddenly sat up and demanded enlightenment as to what was going on; and also declared his intention of going home forthwith. A physician summoned could find nothing amiss with the patient, but it was not until a brother of the supposed auto victim turned up and explained that the latter was in the habit of going to sleep at unconventional times and places, that the mystery was cleared up.

That the man was not run over after he fell is considered rather remarkable, however, since a very heavy traffic was on the road to and from the fair at the time.
