Asks Los Angeles Aid—Other methods not having proved entirely successful, Dr. Milton Rice, president of the Hilo Board of Trade has forwarded a letter to the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, asking cooperation of that body in the establishment of direct steamship connections between Hilo and Los Angeles.

The Company Store—The Oahu Sugar Company, Ltd., of Waipahu, has filed plans at the building inspector's office for a \$60,000 store. The company expects the store to be the most modern structure of its kind in the islands.

Wants More Representation—Senator R. W. Shingle, has announced that a fight will be started to obtain greater representation at the Republican National conventions. Shingle said he would be unable to attend the national committee meeting at Washington to be held January 5 and had given his proxy to Delegate Kuhio. He had also written a letter to the committee protesting the proposal to further reduce the Hawaiian delegation to conventions which is included in a resolution to cut down representation from Southern states.

Will Candy Pines—Articles of incorporation and association have been filed by the Hawaiian Glace Pine-apple company, with plant at 1286 Nuuanu avenue, Honolulu. Its capital stock is \$10,000 and the capacity of the plant is 15,000 pounds of candied pineapples a month. Officers of the company are: B. J. Wright, president; O. M. Staples, vice-president; F. L. Strike Cost Heavily—Losses to the plantations as a result of the strike on Oahu last year are placed \$12,000,000 in an estimate issued from the office of the Planters' Association last week. This is equivalent to \$20.50 a ton on the crop of the Islands. Loss sustained by the laborers through idleness is placed at \$5,000,000, a total cost of \$17,000,000 for the strike.

Phone Company Gets Raise—Permission to raise its rates for 60 days dating from the first of the year was granted the Hawaii Telephone company by the utilities board last Friday. Office phones in Hilo are to cost \$5.50 and \$6.25 and house phones \$3.75 and \$4.50.

Mrs. Hoogs Dies—Mrs. Margaret R. Hoogs, widow of the late Frank Hoogs died in Honolulu last Saturday. She was a well known kamaaina and is survived by two daughters.

When he is about to end it all by suicide, his mind reacts to a realization of the cowardice of self-destruction, and is visualized in a highly dramatic and graphic scene in which his wife appears to him in a vision, recalling him from the depths.

In this scene Walthall has opportunity for that acting which has made him the peer of all actors of the screen in imitative roles. The regeneration of Duane and his return to happiness with his wife are developed through a series of dramatic episodes of tense character in which the "love-pirate" is exposed as a forger and turned over to the police.
