Defeat of Paia by Lahaina on Saturday and of Puunene by Wacs has brought about a tripple tie for leadership of the league and it is an "anybody's race" from now on. With Chartrand in the box Paia showed it is still to be reckoned with and its victory in a game with the "Rainbow" nine on Sunday with another new pitcher in the box further gives support to that view.

It was ragged fielding that beat Paia Saturday afternoon at the Fair grounds for they hit Dunn freely while Lahaina found Chartrand for but one hit. Eleven errors by his teammates however, brought defeat to the former Lahaina pitcher. A close decision by Alfonso at third was also blamed by the Paia's for their down fall. It was a touch and go decision and was rendered as the umpire saw it though he admits it was so close he might have decided in favor of the runner almost as well as for the fielder.

Both Runs Score
Paia scored first on singles by Yemoto and Souza, a sacrifice by Chartrand and a tripple by Foster Robinson. Yemoto having been caught at second meantime. Costly bases on balls, three of them, and a passed ball enabled Lahaina to tie. In the second Gomes singled, Rolph sacrificed and English singled but Paia was unable to cross the rubber and did not score again until the seventh.

It was in the fourth that Lahaina took the lead scoring three runs without a hit and in the seventh another run without a hit came over. Souza singled, Chartrand was given a life at first and Robinson hit for two sacks but was left when McCluskey was out short to first. Paia made another gasp in the eighth but failed to get a run over with the bases full and Robinson made his fourth hit in four times up in the ninth.

Wacs Come Back
After two exhibition that had saddened the Wailuku Fans the Wacs showed form once more on Sunday and capered off with an easy win. They rolled up 5 runs in the first before the Puunene huskies woke up and held their opponents safe through out the game. Puunene played a ragged game throughout and disgusted the fans in the ninth when some of the players started to leave the field following a decision of Umpire Garcia which they disputed, the proposed forfeiture of the game being abated by a fan who had been seated on the players bench. Bill Bal kept the team together.

Tadashi went in the box for Puunene but was supplanted by Bill Bal before the fatal first was over. Bal pitched a game which would have ordinarily have won with proper support. William Cummings singled, Ah Sam tried a sacrifice but both runners were safe on an error of Tadashi. Alfonso walked, Cummings scored on a passed ball, Curtis was safe on an error at first and Ah Sam scored. Wells Cummings singled and Alfonso scored. Enos was hit by pitcher but was caught off first on Ah Sam's throw in of his catch of Masaichi's fly. In the eighth Freitas was given a life by William Cockett but was out at third on a fielder's choice, Tadashi safe. The latter advanced on the sacrifice of Liebig, batting for Silva. Final score 8 to 1.

Three point winners for the United States in the Olympic sports at Antwerp, Duke Kahanamoku, "Bill" Harris and Haig Prieste were chief guests of honor at a dinner at the Grand Hotel, Monday evening, tendered by the swimming committee to the visitors, the officials of the meet, President F. F. Baldwin of the Fair and Racing Association, J. Garcia, chairman of the athletic committee, and J. H. Gray of the publicity committee. As well as an aloha dinner for the swimmers, it took the form of a congratulatory and jubilation affair over the splendid success of the big meet.

Table decorations at the banquet were unique. In the center of the board there had been arranged a miniature lake with sandy beaches. In the lake swam gold fish and upon its glass covered surface and along the beach Kewpie bathing beauties sported and disported.

J. Garcia acted as toastmaster in his usual informal and witty style and responses were made by most of the diners, the visitors telling of their recent experiences, especially of the trip up to the Crater and praising the manner in which the meet was handled and the hospitality extended to them. Chairman Hughes of the swimming committee bestowed credit upon the members of his committee, the judges were heard from and President Baldwin told of how Puunene tank came to be, after saying that he considered swimming the best and most desirable of athletic sports.

The gathering broke up in time for the trio of stars to motor over to Lahaina and take the Mauna Kea for Honolulu.
